

My Brother's Keeper

Option one:

Mentors from Senior Population (DOSAs screens, training through Mentorship)

Internships from Town, local business (engage chambers of commerce, local businesses, WIB and Stem Hub)

Students selected by schools (kids not in extra-curriculars, not engaged)

Carrot to get kids to meet with mentors after school is summer internship

Option two:

Mentors are peers in already-established or newly-created peer mentorship programs (chosen by schools – new program could use training from Mentorship)

Internships from Town, local business (engage chambers of commerce and local businesses as well as WIB and Stem hub)

Students selected by schools (could be in extra-curriculars, as peer mentorship sometimes happens during the school day or before school)

Don't need to show internship as such a carrot as the kids don't need to extend themselves as much to do this kind of peer mentorship. The carrot for the student mentor is putting this on their resume and the paired internship

Internships could be paired – the kid and their mentor could do the internship together.

PILOT program:

TONH has facilities where we could provide internships in Westbury (YWC has the facility itself plus public safety, 311, TV studio), Manhasset (Town Hall has town attorney, DOITT, HR, Admin, BTDC, Supervisor's office, Comptroller, townstat), Port Washington (Manorhaven has various summer jobs, Parks in Port, could place kids in Senior center, Port Parking (?)), Roslyn facility is public safety right near the school), New Hyde Park (CGM).
