SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Good evening everybody. Welcome to Town Board meeting of North Hempstead, May 19th. I would ask that we all rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Thank you. So good evening. Once again we find ourselves conducting our meeting remotely. We've all been impacted by this pandemic in one way or another. Our hearts go out to all of those who are suffering with the virus, as well as those who have lost loved ones. Here at the Town, we continue to provide essential government services while planning for the day when we can return to some sense of normalcy. Since our last board meeting, our parks and trails have opened for passive use, as well as our golf course, tennis courts and Town dock. We're working towards expanding the services we are providing as long as we can do it in a way that is safe for our residents and for our Town workforce. I want to sincerely thank the members of this Town Council, as well as our Town Clerk and Receiver of Taxes, who are working tirelessly on behalf of our residents to make all of this happen. A special thank you to our medical emergency and essential workers and, of course, our Town employees, who are going above and beyond during this unprecedented time. We truly owe all of them a debt of gratitude for the exceptional work they're doing day in and day out. These are extremely challenging times for all of us. But as long as we work together, follow social distancing and wear masks when we can't, we will get through this. We're a family here in North Hempstead and it has never been more apparent than now. So thank you all. And with that, Mr. Wink, if you'd please call the meeting to order.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Oh, I'm sorry. Mr. Wink, if you'd please begin the agenda. I'm getting rusty.

MR. WINK: No, no, no. Without public comment, the whole rhythm is thrown off.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Exactly.

MR. WINK: Public hearings. Item 1, a public hearing to consider the adoption of a local law amending Local Law No. 1 of 2020, adopted March 30, 2020, to extend the moratorium in the Waterfront Business (B-W) District.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: My office facilitated several productive steering committee meetings before the Coronavirus pandemic hit and I feel we're getting close to a new proposed Code for the B-W Zone. However, we weren't quite there yet and the pandemic stalled our progress. There are a couple of concerns the steering committee still needs to work through once we are able to reconvene. Unfortunately, we do not know exactly when that will be. The moratorium is currently set to expire on June 1st. And if we could begin meeting again tomorrow, is not enough time for the steering committee to perform its work with the thought and care it requires. Therefore, I am proposing that the moratorium be extended until September 14th, 2020. Mr. Wink, do we have any e-mails, comments or questions?

MR. WINK: As of now, we've received a total of six e-mails. In no particular order, although I think they're chronological. The first e-mail is from William Marman. And William Marman is expressing support for extending the moratorium. The second e-mail that I received is from Kathleen Walsh-Schoenhower and she, too, is expressing support for extending the moratorium. An organization called the PWWA, which I believe is the Port Washington Waterfront Association, e-mailed also to express support for the extension of the moratorium. Number 4 is Lori Rothstein, who also expresses support for the moratorium. Five, by my calculations, is from the Manhasset Bay Yacht Club, William Cornacio, Past Commodore. It too acknowledges the need to extend the moratorium. And the final one in my possession is from Tricia and Robert Wallace with the Mitchell Farms Neighborhood Association and they, too, favor extending the moratorium. So those are the six e-mails I've received at the time of the beginning of this meeting and all of them in one form or another approve of extending the moratorium to September 14th.

RESOLUTION NO. 170 - 2020

A PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER THE ADOPTION OF A LOCAL LAW AMENDING LOCAL LAW NO. 1 OF 2020, ADOPTED MARCH 30, 2020, TO EXTEND THE MORATORIUM IN THE WATERFRONT BUSINESS (B-W) DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the Town Board, as the legislative body of the Town of North Hempstead, is empowered to enact local laws pursuant to the provisions of Article 9 of the New York State Constitution, the Town Law, and the Municipal Home Rule Law; and

WHEREAS, a proposed Local Law has been prepared, pursuant to enabling legislation, to amend Local Law No. 1 of 2020, adopted March 30, 2020, in order to extend the building moratorium in the Waterfront Business (B-W) District through September 14, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Local Law, in final form, has been on the desks or tables of all the members of the Town Board for seven calendar days, exclusive of Sunday; and

WHEREAS, due notice has been heretofore given of a public hearing to be held on the 19th day of May, 2020, concerning the adoption of the proposed Local Law, which Local Law was available for viewing by the public on the Town's website and during regular business hours in the Office of the Town Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has carefully considered the proposed Local Law during the seven-day period, conducted a public hearing on May 19, 2020, with respect to the Local Law, and has afforded all interested persons an opportunity to be heard at the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, this Board deems it in the public interest to adopt the proposed Local Law, to be effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State of the State of New York (the "Secretary of State").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED that Local Law No. 2 of 2020 be and it hereby is adopted, which Local Law reads as follows:

TOWN OF NORTH HEMPSTEAD LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF 2020

Section 1. Legislative Intent.

BUSINESS (B-W) DISTRICT.

Since the adoption of Local Law No. 11 of 2017, establishing a building moratorium in the Waterfront Business (B-W) District, the Town has received invaluable comment from interested residents, businesses, community groups and public officials as to zoning code changes affecting the District. In order to give thorough consideration to the comments received, the Town Board has extended the building moratorium, most recently on March 30, 2020, when the Town Board passed Local Law No. 1 of 2020 to extend the moratorium until June 1, 2020. While the moratorium has been in effect the Town Board has continued to receive additional comment from all parties interested in zoning code changes affecting the District. In order to allow for the Town to finalize the proposed zoning code changes, due to the closures of Town facilities as a result of the coronavirus pandemic, the Town Board of the Town of North Hempstead finds that it is in the best interest of the Town to amend Local Law No. 1 of 2020, adopted March 30, 2020, in order to extend the moratorium through September 14, 2020.

Section 2.

Section 2 of Local Law No. 13 of 2019 is hereby amended as follows:

During the period commencing December 28, 2017 and terminating on [June] <u>September</u> 1<u>4</u>, the Town's Department of Building Safety, Inspection and Enforcement shall not issue any building permits, demolition permits, special permits or any other discretionary approval for any property within the Waterfront Business District (B-W), including the following properties, which are identified by reference to the Land and Tax Map of Nassau County:

Section 5, Block B, Lots 171, 46, 500

Section 5, Block C, Lots 9, 431, 2, 428, 427, 462, 463, 16, 429, 430

Section 5, Block H, Lot 2 and 43

Section 3.

Section 3 of Local Law No. 13 of 2019 is hereby amended as followed:

This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State and shall remain in full force and effect through [June] September 14, 2020.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

The projects include: The replacement, installation of smart meters, which will help to regular bills; Watermain replacement; and, Six projects at wells help us remediation contamination. I did want to note also that the District will be holding a public hearing by telephone on May 27th. That's next week, Tuesday. And the information actually has been sent out and if you want more information, you can contact the Water District. I'd like to -- sorry – offer the resolution and move to set the tentative hearing date for the 18th.

RESOLUTION NO. 172 - 2020

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF NORTH HEMPSTEAD, NEW YORK, ADOPTED ON MAY 19, 2020, CALLING FOR A PUBLIC HEARING TO BE HELD ON JUNE 18, 2020, FOR THE INCREASE AND IMPROVEMENT OF FACILITIES OF THE WESTBURY WATER DISTRICT, PURSUANT TO SECTION 202-b OF THE TOWN LAW.

WHEREAS, the Westbury Water District (herein called the "District") in the Town of North Hempstead (herein called the "Town"), in the County of Nassau, New York, has requested that the Town Board undertake proceedings pursuant to Section 202-b of the Town Law for the increase and improvement of facilities of the District, consisting of water distribution and treatment system upgrades and improvements to address anticipated new drinking water standards and to maintain existing District infrastructure, including (i) the installation of advanced Oxidation Process systems at Wells 6 and 7A, 11, 10 and 14 and 16; (ii) the installation of Granular Activated Carbon systems at Wells 12, 15 and 18 and (iii) water main and meter replacements (collectively, the "Project"), all as further described in the map, plan and report prepared by D&B Engineers and Architects, P.C. ("D&B"), engineers duly licensed by the State of New York, entitled "Report on the Need for Improvements of Various Water Supply Facilities for 2020 Bond Issue," dated April 2020 (the "Engineer's Report"), at the estimated maximum cost of \$73,620,000, including any ancillary or related work necessary in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS, the District expects to receive grant funds in the amount of \$7,389,000 from New York State to fund a portion of the cost of the installation of the Advanced Oxidation Process systems at Well 6 and 7A; and

WHEREAS, the District expects to receive grant funds in the amount of \$680,850 from New York State to fund a portion of the cost of the installation of the Granular Activated Carbon system at Well 12; and

4) In order to be eligible for an application or permit refund as described above, the applicant or permittee must be the property owner or the tenant/business owner in control of the premises for which the refund is sought.

Memorandum of Agreement ("Agreement") entered into as of this ______day of ______, 2020, by and between the Town of North Hempstead, a public employer in the State of New York, having its principal place of business at 220 Plandome Road, Manhasset, New York hereinafter referred to as "the Town", and the Civil Service Employees Association, Inc, Local 1000, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, Nassau Municipal Employees Local #882, Town of North Hempstead Unit #7555, N.Y., an employee organization having its principal place of business at 143 Washington Avenue, Albany NY 12210 hereinafter referred to as "CSEA".

WITNESSETH

Whereas, the Town and CSEA are parties to a collective bargaining agreement set to expire on December 31, 2022; and

Whereas, the Town and the CSEA desire to provide an opportunity for employees to obtain antibody testing and donate convalescent plasma to combat the spread of coronavirus; and

Whereas, the Town and CSEA have agreed upon the terms and conditions for paid leave for employees wishing to obtain testing or donate plasma; and

Now, therefore, it is agreed by and between the undersigned parties for the Town and CSEA that each will recommend the following amended terms and conditions to their respective principals for ratification, and to continue those un-amended provisions of the current collective bargaining agreement ("CBA").

 Section XVI O. MISCELLANEOUS – Amend to add the following as subsection "Q" – "COVID-19 ANTIBODY TESTING AND PLASMA DONATION":

For the duration of the coronavirus pandemic, Town employees, who have recovered from Covid-19 and who are otherwise eligible to donate convalescent plasma, may be allowed to take up to four (4) hours annually of paid leave without charge to leave credits for the purpose of making such donation. Town employees may also be allowed to take up to four (4) hours annually of paid leave without charge to leave credits, to receive antibody testing. The four hours shall include the time during which the donation is made and/or the testing performed. Request to utilize this leave must be made, in writing, to the Department Head. Compensatory time, if applicable, cannot be combined with this paid leave. Proof of donation or testing should be provided to the Human Resources Department.

Except as modified above, all other remaining contractual provisions related to the collective bargaining agreement shall continue in full force and effect.

It is further agreed by and between the parties that this Agreement shall not become effective until the ratification by CSEA and the Town.

The parties agree and acknowledge that they both participated in the drafting of this Agreement and that the terms of this Agreement, including any ambiguities, are to be construed in accordance with their intended meaning and not against any one party.

Each individual that executes this Agreement expressly asserts that each has the agency and authority to bind the party each represents, subject to the express provisions set forth above.
