SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Good evening. Would you all please rise and join us in the Pledge of Allegiance.

(Pledge of Allegiance was recited.)

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Thank you. Mr. Wink, if you could please call the meeting to order.

MR. WINK: Town of North Hempstead board meeting, Thursday, May 20th, 2021.

Councilwoman Dalimonte.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Here.

MR. WINK: Councilman Ferrara.

COUNCILMAN FERRARA: Here.

MR. WINK: Councilwoman Lurvey. She appears to be frozen.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: Here.

MR. WINK: Okay, I hear you. Councilwoman Russell.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: Here.

MR. WINK: Councilwoman Seeman.

COUNCILWOMAN SEEMAN: Here.

MR. WINK: Councilman Zuckerman.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Here.

MR. WINK: Supervisor Bosworth.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Here. So following our Town Board procedure, we do open the meeting with 30 minutes of public comment on any matters not having to do with the items on the agenda. So Mr. Wink, are there any comments that you have, any cards?

MR. WINK: I have received one set of comments from Pete Gaffney with respect to open comments.

(Off-the-record discussion.)

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Mr. Wink, if you'd please begin tonight's agenda.

MR. WINK: Continuations: Item 1: A public hearing to consider the adoption of a local law amending Chapter 2 of the Town Code entitled "Administration and Enforcement."

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: Mr. Wink, could you call the first three items.

MR. WINK: Sure. Item 2: A public hearing to consider the adoption of a local law amending Chapter 20A of the Town Code entitled "Environmental Planning and Control of Trees."

And Item 3: A public hearing to consider amendments to the Town's tree policy pursuant to Section 20A-4 of the Town Code.

COUNCIL WOMAN LURVEY: So good evening, everyone. We continue to work on revising the Town's tree code provisions and tree policy. The proposed local laws are available for review and public comment on the Town's website. We are continuing to work through feedback on the proposals and comments and we want to assure that everyone has ample opportunity to be heard. This is not my tree code, this is your tree code. The process we're going through is intended to produce proposed local laws that are collaborative, comprehensive and enforceable, that are balanced and that work throughout the Town. Comments related to the draft local laws can be e-mailed to treecodecomments@northhempsteadny.gov for consideration, it will not be made part of the formal record. Comments that will be made part of the formal record can be e-mailed to comments@northhempsteadny.gov. We will not be voting tonight, I will be moving to continue these public hearings to the July 8th, 2021 Town Board meeting. However, if anyone is here wishing to speak on the proposed local laws, we will of course hear your comments. Mr. Wink, I believe we do have some written comments and do we have anyone wishing to speak?

MR. WINK: We have written comments. Perhaps Mr. Gaffney would like to summarize them for himself.

MR. GAFFNEY: Hi. Good evening, again, folks. Actually all I just wanted to was this conversation that I've been e-mailing back and forth to Councilwoman Lurvey. I just want to make sure they are part of the record because as we've gone along and I've looked at it, certain things have hit me. Just the other day I saw a tree that was being absolutely butchered cut down and this was over in Hempstead. And I bet you the tree is going to die in six months the way it was absolutely cut down, it's a shame. There will be people that are trying to circumvent this law that everybody is trying to have. Plus there was a few other things. The idea of contractors, I think that's going to be your biggest problem because of these mega-development houses that are being done and what people are doing inside their property. There was one in the Town of Westbury recently, actually it was on the side street, but it's in the Town of Westbury. The person put in a pool and hot tub, they took down nine trees that were on the actual property line. They are not replaced, that's something that's terrible. So that's where I think the big target could be and as we go along we'll find out more. But anyway, thank you for that. But those written records, Councilwoman Lurvey, if you could put those e-mails into the consideration, I'd

appreciate it.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: Absolutely.

MR. GAFFNEY: Thank you very much.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: Your e-mails have been noted. They have been, in some cases, responded to where we could respond immediately, and in other cases are being reviewed as we look at the proposed laws as a whole. But they are very much being taken into consideration and I thank you.

MR. GAFFNEY: And I thank you for your efforts and the Town's efforts. You guys do a good job, just sometimes I see things, maybe, a little bit different and I just want to kind of point it out and try to help make it better for all of us. Thank you.

MR. WINK: Thank you, Mr. Gaffney.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: We always say you're our eyes and ears. So as much as we try to note everything, it's helpful when concerned residents, like yourself, give us input and it is appreciated.

MR. WINK: Next speaker is Michael O'Donald.

MR. O'DONALD: I just want to give accolades to the Councilwoman Lurvey and the rest of the Town Board too. What you have done and what you are doing, remember over the years I've been screaming and yelling, I'm not a tree hugger, but trees are beautiful. The climate change weather it helps and whatever, but I read all the reports and everything else and I said to family and friends, I put everything in there I've been screaming and yelling about. The Town does listen. Councilwoman, you're doing an excellent job, the committee, and Pete Gaffney keeps me updated on all these other things going on. So I thank you and I thank the rest of the Town, you guys are doing a great job on trees. I just had to put my accolades in there, really great. And Viviana, I enjoy your car.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: So the purpose of the proposed local law is to update and clarify the requirements for obtaining a structure permit. In this case it's to review dock applications and streamline them. We are going to be continuing this to June 16th, 2021 to allow for additional changes to the construction permit process. Mr. Wink, are there any comments that you are aware of?

MR. WINK: I have no comments on this item.

Schedule XXVII of the Uniform Traffic Code entitled "Snow Emergency Routes."

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: So the proposed local law would update the Snow Emergency

Routes first contained in TC27-71 of the Town of North Hempstead Uniform Traffic Code.

We're going to be continuing this item as well to June 16th to allow for continued review of the streets that are being added to the list.

Mr. Wink, do we have any comments?

MR. WINK: I have no comments on

this item.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: I'd like to continue the public hearing to June 16th, 2021.

MR. WINK: I apologize, Supervisor. Mr. Gaffney, do you wish to be heard on this?

MR. GAFFNEY: Yes. Hello, I'm sorry. Yeah, on 5, many residents they park their vehicles on snow emergency streets, they are not aware that their vehicles need to be removed from the streets during an emergency. The Town should provide additional communications prior to that emergency. And possibly communicate emergency reminders to the Town's newsletters two times a year. Update the Town's website to include a "things to do and have in emergencies." Provide civic organizations and chambers of commerce websites emergency info, include phone calls, e-blasts, local papers. And ultimately, if none of that stuff works, threaten to tow the vehicles. That's all I have to say. I just think we need to get the word out better to get these cars off the road because the guys who do snow plow they do a fantastic job in this area and why make it so hard.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: So just to say, whenever there is a big snowstorm, we do robo calls, we urge people to take their cars off the streets whether it's a snow emergency street or not for that exact purpose so that our plowers can plow the roads. We urge people to get the cars off the street, to keep it in their driveways to not shovel snow into the streets, shovel it on to their lawns. But these are all good suggestions that we'll take into consideration. I thank you.

MR. GAFFNEY: Thank you.

MR. WINK: I'm told that Michael O'Donald wishes to speak on this item as well.

MR. O'DONALD: Yes, thank you. A little different. On the route in the unincorporated areas where I live in North New Hyde Park, the main streets, fine, they are taken care of when the plow comes through, as Pete said, and you are all aware neighbors don't comply. Most of my neighbors have 150-foot driveways, they leave the cars out in the street. I've spoken to the neighbors. As I suggested in the past about doing a pilot program in this area, especially the Lakeville Estates area where alternate side, have a program one year you go on the odd number side, one year on the even number side to see if there is a compliance with these regulations. Rather, parts of the Town unincorporated I notice up in Port Washington some of the areas, same problem, where they don't move the cars. Why should the plow driver have the difficulty of maneuvering back and forth all over the place without hitting somebody or getting injured himself or doing a lousy job in cleaning the street. So I think the Town would possibly look at the Council members, a pilot program in particular areas like Lakeville Estates here, a smaller area, of one year it's the odd numbers, the next year it's the even numbers to correct the problem. COUNCILMAN FERRARA: We did look at that a number of years ago and a lot of people's comments were they moved out here to get away from that in the city. And the problem is if they are not going to move the car while it's snowing, they are certainly not going to move it when it's not snowing. I mean, I guess it's an -- again, something we could look at it, but it has been looked at in the past and people have balked at wanting to do any of that.

MR. O'DONALD: I understand, Councilman. This is a resistance to government telling me what to do, I completely understand it. But the fire trucks couldn't get through some of these streets, forget about ambulance. I see an ambulance get stuck because he couldn't get down the street.

COUNCILMAN FERRARA: I can't understand you, I can't hear you.

MR. O'DONALD: I said fire trucks have a problem getting down the street.

COUNCILMAN FERRARA: I know that, but the problem is alternate side of the street parking is not going to resolve that because if they are not following the law now they are not going to follow it later and all you're doing is upsetting a lot more people who say we don't want alternate side of the street, we don't want this to become New York City, that's why we moved out of New York City.

MR. O'DONALD: I understand that. I've been here for over 50 years like you and we like the

country atmosphere. But of course, the increasing numbers of the people, the increasing number of cars, something has to be done. Some of correction on. Education doesn't seem to work. I know our civic is out there, we put fliers on people's door and bang the doorbells. Food for thought, thank you.

COUNCILMAN FERRARA: Thank you.

MR. O'DONALD: Before I heard we'll not see your face anymore.

COUNCILMAN FERRARA: You'll probably still see my face, not that a lot of people want to.

MR. O'DONALD: Angelo, it's been a pleasure all these years.

Supervisor Bosworth offered the following resolution and moved its adoption, which resolution was declared adopted after a poll of the members of this Board:

RESOLUTION NO. 260 - 2021

A PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER THE ADOPTION OF A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 2 OF THE TOWN CODE ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT."

WHEREAS, the Town Board, as the legislative body of the Town of North Hempstead, is empowered to amend the Town Code pursuant to the provisions of Article 9 of the New York State Constitution, the Town Law, and the Municipal Home Rule Law; and

WHEREAS, a proposed Local Law has been prepared, pursuant to enabling legislation, to amend Chapter 2 of the Town Code entitled "Administration and Enforcement" in order to eliminate the requirement that applicants for a plumber's license with the Town of North Hempstead be United States citizens; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Local Law, in final form, has been on the desks or tables of all the members of the Town Board for seven calendar days, exclusive of Sunday; and

WHEREAS, due notice has been heretofore given of a public hearing to be held on the 20th day of May, 2021, via Zoom concerning the adoption of the proposed Local Law, which Local Law was available for viewing by the public on the Town's website and during regular business hours in the Office of the Town Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board carefully considered the proposed Local Law during the aforesaid seven-day period, conducted said hearing on May 20, 2021 via Zoom, with respect to said Local Law, and has afforded all interested persons an opportunity to be heard at the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, this Board deems it in the public interest to adopt said proposed Local Law, to be effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State of the State of New York (the "Secretary of State").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED that Local Law No. 10 of 2021 be and it hereby is adopted, which Local Law reads as follows:

TOWN OF NORTH HEMPSTEAD LOCAL LAW NO. 10 OF 2021

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 2 OF THE TOWN CODE

ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT"

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of North Hempstead, as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Intent

The Board finds that it is in the best interest of the Town of North Hempstead to amend Chapter 2 of the Town Code entitled "Administration and Enforcement" in order to eliminate the requirement that applicants for a plumber's license with the Town of North Hempstead have to be United States Citizens.

Section 2.

Chapter 2 of the Town Code is hereby amended as follows: § 2-35 Examining Board of Plumbers

- A. Appointment. Immediately upon the adoption of this ordinance a committee of three plumbers shall be appointed an Examining Board of Plumbers for the term of three years, two years and one year, respectively, and thereafter their successors shall be appointed annually for the full term of three years. Members of the Board shall be master or journeyman plumbers who shall have had not less than 10 years' practical experience in the plumbing trade. Each member of such Examining Board of Plumbers shall receive such compensation as the Town Board may determine for each day actually and necessarily spent in the work of this Board, not to exceed four in one calendar month.
- B. Meetings. The Board shall meet at the call of the Chairman. Notice of a meeting of the Board shall be given by phone, email or by mailing notice of the time and place of the meeting, addressed to each member at his last post office address, at least five days before the time of such meeting.
- C. Regulations. The Board shall make rules and regulations for the conduct of its business as an Examining Board.
- D. Qualifications of plumbers. No person shall engage in the business of plumbing within the Town of North Hempstead until he or she shall obtain a certificate of competency or license from the Examining Board of Plumbers mentioned in Subsection A of this section.
- E. Application for examination. Persons applying for a certificate to engage in the business of master or employing plumber shall file with the Board an application on such forms as may be prescribed by the Board, and shall furnish to the Board such information as it may require concerning the applicant's fitness and qualifications to receive a certificate. All applications must be under oath.
- F. Each applicant shall be required to furnish vouchers from two persons, who shall sign under oath on forms prescribed by the Board, certifying to the time the

applicant has been employed by them as journeyman plumber or the period of time they have known such applicant as master or employing plumber.

- G. Any person desiring a master plumber's license shall apply, in writing, to the Examining Board of Plumbers, which Board shall arrange for an examination of such applicant.
- H. The Board shall refuse to receive an application from any person who may be unlawfully engaged in business as a master or employing plumber.
- I. All applications shall expire and be canceled after a period of one year if the applicant does not appear for examination or reexamination within that period.
- J. Examination will be required for each applicant, with the exception of the following:
- (1) Where the applicant, at the time of making the application, maintains a principal place of business within the County of Nassau and has been duly licensed as a master plumber by a municipality within the County of Nassau with whom the Town of North Hempstead has entered into a reciprocity agreement. Such applicant shall, however, file with the Board the required application, together with a certificate of competency and a certified copy of a currently valid master plumber's license. Upon approval of the application such applicant shall be considered a duly licensed master plumber within the Town of North Hempstead.
- (2) Examination shall be waived for applicants who are currently a duly licensed master or employing plumber in any other municipality in the State of New York, and who submit a certified copy of a certificate of competency issued by the Examining Board of Plumbers in such municipality, and who maintain a principal place of business in such municipality, provided that such municipality has signified, in writing, its willingness to reciprocate in like manner with the Examining Board of Plumbers of the Town of North Hempstead. Such applicant shall receive a license only. No certificate of competency shall be issued to any applicants unless they have been examined by the Examining Board of Plumbers of the Town of North Hempstead.
- K. Experience. No person shall be examined unless he or she shall have had at least five years' experience as a journeyman plumber and is able to furnish satisfactory evidence of such fact. [No application will be received from any person who is not a citizen of the United States.]
- L. Examinations. The examination of the Board shall be in two parts, namely a practical test to determine the applicant's skill as a journeyman and a written examination. The written examination shall consist of questions and be planned to determine the applicant's fitness and qualifications to engage in the business of master or employing plumber.

- M. The time of holding the examination shall be left to the discretion of the Board. Ample notice shall be given to the applicants.
- N. Persons who pass the tests as prescribed by the Board shall be eligible to receive a certificate of competency as master or employing plumber. A person who fails in the practical test shall not be eligible for another test until the expiration of three months; should he or she fail in the second test, he or she will not be eligible for a third test until the expiration of six months; and failing in the third test, he or she will not be eligible for a fourth test until the expiration of one year. An applicant who fails in the written examinations shall not be eligible for reexamination until the expiration of one month; should he or she fail in the second examination, he or she will not be eligible for another examination until the expiration of six months; and should he or she fail in the fourth examination, he will not be eligible for another examination until the expiration of one year.
- O. Fitness of applicant. Before issuing a certificate to engage in the business of master or employing plumber, the Board shall inquire into the applicant's fitness and qualifications for conducting such business and may require the applicant to submit under oath such evidence, in addition to the examinations and tests hereinbefore provided, as will satisfy the Board that he or she is a person of good repute, character and responsibility and otherwise qualified to engage in business as a master or employing plumber.
- P. Fees. Each applicant for a master plumber's license, except as may be otherwise provided by reciprocity agreement with other municipalities within the County of Nassau, shall pay a fee in the amount indicated in the Town of North Hempstead Fee Schedule.
- Q. Applications for renewal of licenses shall be filed during the month of December in the year in which the license expires with the Examining Board, together with such verification of the plumbing work performed under the authority of the prior license as the Board may require to determine the continuing competency of the licensee. Renewals shall be for periods of up to three years from January 1. The fee for license renewals shall be paid in accordance with the Town of North Hempstead Fee Schedule.
- R. Any licensed plumber who has not secured a renewal by the first of March of each year following the year in which the license expires shall be required to make a new application and be reexamined and pay the fee shown in the Town of North Hempstead Fee Schedule for each such examination and license.
- S. Duplicate certificates.
- (1) In case a certificate of competency is lost by the holder thereof, the Board may issue a duplicate. In other cases, the Board shall issue a certificate of record stating that the records of the office show that a certificate was issued to a specific person. The charge

for a duplicate certificate of competency or a certificate of record shall be the amount stated in the Town of North Hempstead Fee Schedule.

- (2) In case the sticker required to be affixed to a vehicle operated by a licensed plumber in the course of business shall be lost by the holder thereof or in case additional stickers shall be required, the Board may issue duplicate or additional vehicle stickers for the fee shown in the Town of North Hempstead Fee Schedule.
- T. Insurance. Every master plumber shall file with the Examining Board of Plumbers, before beginning operations under the license, a certificate of insurance as evidence of public liability insurance which shall contain amounts of \$100,000/\$300,000 bodily injury and not less than \$25,000 property damage. Such certificate of insurance shall be issued to the Town of North Hempstead and shall contain a provision that no policy cancellation or material modification to such policy shall be made except on at least 15 days' prior written notice by certified mail to the Town. The required insurance shall be obtained from an insurance company authorized to do business in the State of New York. In the event that the required insurance shall be canceled, not renewed or materially modified with the result that the required insurance is not in effect, the Town may direct the master plumber to suspend work.
- U. Suspension and revocation of licenses.
- (1) Subject to compliance with the requirements stated in Subsections U(2) and (3) below, the Commissioner of Buildings may revoke (or suspend for a period of up to one year) a certificate of competency or license granted under the provisions of this article for any of the following reasons:
- (a) Failure to file an application for a permit prior to the installation of plumbing work; or
- (b) Failure to take the required action called for upon receipt of a violation notice; or
- (c) Performance of plumbing work in violation of the requirements of this Chapter; or
- (d) Renting or lending a license to a third party; or [Amended 9-6-2018 by L.L. No. 7-2018]
 - (e) Being convicted of a felony; or
 - (f) Altering or defacing a certificate of inspection or approval; or
- (g) Filing an application to perform plumbing work for a person not licensed by the Town of North Hempstead.
- (2) Any suspension or revocation pursuant to Subsection U(1) above may only be effected after a hearing by the Examining Board of Plumbers on the proposed suspension or revocation. The notice of hearing shall state the date, time and location of the hearing and the reasons [as stated in Subsection U(1) above] forming the basis for

the proposed revocation or suspension. The notice of hearing shall be served either personally or by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the licensee's last known address at least 10 days prior to the hearing. The licensee shall have an opportunity to appear and be heard in relation to the proposed revocation or suspension, and may be represented by counsel. Minutes of the hearing shall be transcribed by a court reporter. The Commissioner of Buildings shall attend the hearing. The hearing shall be considered a "quasi-judicial proceeding" for purposes of Article 7 of the New York Public Officers Law.

(3) Within 10 days of the hearing, the Examining Board of Plumbers shall present the Commissioner of Buildings with its recommendations as to whether to suspend or revoke the certificate of competency or license. Upon receipt of the recommendations, the Commissioner of Buildings may either accept or reject the Examining Board of Plumbers' recommendations and revoke or suspend the certificate of competency or license. The revocation or suspension shall be effectuated by notice to the licensee by personal service or by certified mail, return receipt requested.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

RESOLUTION NO. 262 - 2021

A PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER THE ADOPTION OF A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 70 OF THE TOWN CODE ENTITLED "ZONING."

WHEREAS, the Town Board, as the legislative body of the Town of North Hempstead is empowered to amend the Town Code pursuant to the provisions of Article 9 of the New York State Constitution, the Town Law, and the Municipal Home Rule Law; and

WHEREAS, a proposed Local Law has been prepared, pursuant to enabling legislation, to amend Chapter 70 of the Town Code entitled "Zoning" in order to modify the types of signs that are prohibited within the Town; to amend the provisions related to the destruction of devices, including municipal signs, within a Public Highway; and to modify the penalties for offenses related to certain types of prohibited signs; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Local Law, in final form, has been on the desks or tables of all the members of the Town Board for seven calendar days, exclusive of Sunday; and

WHEREAS, due notice was heretofore given of a public hearing to be held on May 20, 2021 via Zoom, concerning the adoption of the proposed Local Law, which Local Law was available for viewing by the public on the Town's website and during regular business hours in the Office of the Town Clerk; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to General Municipal Law § 239-m, the Nassau County Planning Commission (the "Commission") was furnished with a copy of the proposed local law; and

WHEREAS, the Nassau County Planning Commission, pursuant to Resolution No. 10415-21, dated March 25, 2021, has recommended local determination; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has carefully considered the proposed Local Law during the seven-day period, conducted a public hearing on May 20, 2021 via Zoom, with respect to the Local Law, and has afforded all interested persons an opportunity to be heard at the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the Act's implementing regulations (the "SEQRA Regulations") the Department of Planning and Environmental Protection has recommended that the adoption of the Local Law be determined to be a Type II Action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(33) of the SEQRA Regulations and, as such, no further environmental review is required; and

WHEREAS, this Board deems it in the public interest to adopt the proposed Local

Law, to be effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State of the State of New York (the "Secretary of State").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED that the Town Board determines that the adoption of the Local Law is a Type II Action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(33) of the SEQRA Regulations and, as such, no further environmental review is required; and be it further

RESOLVED that Local Law No. 12 of 2021 be and it hereby is adopted, which Local Law reads as follows:

TOWN OF NORTH HEMPSTEAD LOCAL LAW NO. 12 OF 2021

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 70 OF THE TOWN CODE, ENTITLED "ZONING"

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of North Hempstead, as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Intent.

The Board finds that it is in the best interest of the Town of North Hempstead to make amendments to Chapter 70 of the Town Code entitled "Zoning" in order to modify the types of signs that are prohibited within the Town; to amend the provisions related to the destruction of devices, including municipal signs, within a Public Highway; and to modify the penalties for offenses related to certain types of prohibited signs.

Section 2.

Chapter 70 of the Town Code is hereby amended as follows: § 70-196 Permitted signs.

The following signs shall be permitted in any use district in accordance with the requirements of this article:

- A. Professional nameplate. In residential districts, professional nameplates bearing the name and profession of the resident, not exceeding two square feet in area or more than one such sign in number, and which may be illuminated by an electric lamp not exceeding 15 watts of power contained within the sign; in nonresidential districts, on professional office buildings having two or more occupants, only one wall or ground sign containing the names of all occupants shall be permitted.
- B. Sale or rent sign advertising the sale or rental only of the real property on which it may be located, provided there be only one such sign, not to exceed four square feet in area and located not less than 20 feet from any property line. Where such sign is not attached to a building, it shall be attached to a standard sunk in the ground, and no part of said sign shall be more than five feet above the ground.

- C. Building contractor's, subcontractor's, architect's or engineer's sign, maintained on a building only while the same is under construction, provided that there be only one such sign not exceeding four square feet in area.
- D. Institutional identification sign placed upon a building or lot of a church, hospital, school or public agency, provided that there be only one such sign, not exceeding 16 square feet in area.
- E. Informational signs, directional or traffic signs, or other signs which are erected and maintained only by a governmental agency for the general welfare.
- F. Temporary signs, posters or displays placed by any governmental agency, church or civic organization if such signs are related directly to public, religious or patriotic matters, and otherwise comply with the provisions of this article.
- G. Subdivision sign, advertising an approved subdivision, located on the premises and not less than 25 feet from any lot line, provided that there be only one such sign not to exceed 50 square feet. No renewal of such sign permit shall be issued beyond a period when development of the subdivision has reached 90% of completion.
- H. Danger sign, warning of the condition or danger of travel on a street, may be erected and maintained for a temporary period, provided that such sign does not exceed two square feet in area.
- I. Directional sign, directing persons to a parking area, placed on a side wall of a building, may be erected subject to authorization by the Board of Zoning and Appeals pursuant to Article XXIV of this ordinance.
- J. Signs in business or industrial districts. The following signs shall be permitted only in business or industrial districts in accordance with the requirements of this article:
- (1) Wall sign, attached to and parallel to a building wall on a public street or parking area and advertising only the business conducted in such building; provided that:
- (a) There be only one such sign for each wall on any wall where such sign is permitted.
- (b) The sign on the building wall facing upon a public street shall not exceed 4 1/2 feet in vertical measurement or two square feet per linear foot of wall width. The sign on the building wall facing upon a parking area shall not exceed two feet in vertical measurement or one square foot per linear foot of wall width, but in no case shall exceed 24 square feet in area.
- (c) The sign is not wider than the building upon which it is placed.
- (d) The sign or any part thereof, including lighting devices and reflectors, does not project more than one foot from such wall, but in no case shall extend into any right-of-way.
- (e) The sign does not extend higher than the roof of any building.
- (f) The sign is not higher than the distance between the head of the windows of one story and the lower sill course of the windows of the next higher story, or the top of the parapet wall if a one-story building, and in no event shall the top of the sign be higher than 18 feet above the mean level of the ground.
- (g) Any such sign shall be maintained in a good state of repair, in working order and neatly painted; all projecting lighting devices, including reflectors and all parts thereof, shall be painted aluminum on the outside.
- (h) The provisions of Subsections J(1)(a) through J(1)(g) above shall not prohibit a sign projecting not more than one foot from the wall of any building and not more than

one foot by one foot in area used to indicate the location on the premises of a public telephone or other public utility facility for the use of the general public.

- (i) All signs in shopping centers shall be uniform in appearance, construction and dimensions. [Added 8-26-1980 by L.L. No. 13-1980]
- (2) Detached or ground sign, advertising only the business conducted on the premises upon which the sign is located, provided that:
- (a) There be only one such sign detached from a building.
- (b) Such sign shall not exceed 24 square feet in area or 15 feet in height from the mean level of the ground.
- (c) Such sign shall be located not less than 10 feet from any property line.
- (d) An open space of at least three feet in height shall be maintained between the bottom of the sign and the ground.
- (e) The area between the sign and front property line shall be maintained free of weeds and debris.
- (3) A tower sign, advertising only the business conducted in such building, provided that:
- (a) Said sign is an integral part and made of the same material as the front of the building.
- (b) There be only one such sign.
- (c) The sign shall not exceed 100 square feet in area nor 10 feet in any dimension.
- (d) The top of the sign shall not exceed 35 feet in height from the mean level of the ground.
- (e) There shall be no moving parts or any flashing, changing, intermittent or varying illumination in connection therewith.
- (4) Window signs, provided that the total area of all such window signs located in a window does not exceed one-third (1/3) of the total area of such window. For purposes of this subsection, a "window sign" shall mean a sign of any material which is either temporarily or permanently attached or affixed to the interior or exterior surface of a display window and is used for advertisements, announcements or notices, directional matters, company names or trade names and which is related to the business, products or services provided. Window signs shall not require permits as otherwise provided herein. [Added 8-26-1980 by L.L. No. 13-1980]
- (5) Hanging sign or blade sign, attached to and perpendicular to a building wall on a public street or parking area and advertising only the business conducted in such building, provided that: [Added 10-22-2020 by L.L. No. 14-2020]
- (a) There be only one such sign per business in addition to any other permitted signage.
- (b) The sign shall not exceed six square feet of surface area per side.
- (c) The sign is six or fewer inches thick.
- (d) The sign is attached to the building wall no more than 15 feet from the entrance of the business it advertises.
- (e) There are no other blade or hanging signs within 15 feet.
- (f) The blade or hanging sign extends no further than the lesser of 42 inches from the building or a distance equivalent to 1/2 the width of the sidewalk.
- (g) No portion of the blade or hanging sign is more than 15 feet above grade or the roof of the building.

- (h) No portion of the blade or hanging sign is less than eight feet above grade.
- (i) There shall be no means of internal illumination.
- (j) Exterior lighting shall be from above or the side of the sign attached to the building wall, facade, or soffit face; lamps shall not project more than 1 1/2 feet from the building wall, facade, or soffit face; such illumination shall not result in confusion with traffic signals, either because of color or proximity.
- (k) Signs must be durable, sturdy, and stable and must be designed, constructed and installed to withstand one-hundred-ten-mile-per-hour gusts of wind and rain.
- (I) The bracket holding the hanging sign shall be mounted above the sign only; brackets shall be attached to the building wall, facade, or soffit face only; brackets attached to the top of the soffit or roof shall be prohibited.
- (6) Temporary grand opening displays. Notwithstanding § 70-197(D) of the Town Code, a temporary grand opening display shall be permitted under this chapter, subject to the following:
- (a) Grand opening displays shall be limited to signs, flags, pennants, banners and similar items, which displays shall be hung on the building or from the building, but shall, in all cases, be within the property line of the building and shall not exceed the height thereof. In no event shall illuminated displays or signs be permitted hereunder.
- (b) No grand opening display shall be permitted for a period of longer than 14 calendar days.
- (c) Grand opening displays shall not exceed three feet by 15 feet.
- (d) For purposes of this subsection, "grand opening" shall mean a promotional activity not exceeding 14 calendar days within two months after initial occupancy, used by newly established, newly renovated or under-new-management businesses, for which all required licenses, permits and certificates of occupancy and/or completion have been issued, to inform the public of their location and services available to the community. "Grand opening" or "grand reopening" does not mean an annual or occasional promotion by a business.

 (e) Grand opening displays shall be subject to all accessibility and fire safety regulations.
- (f) Dangerous signs. Should a grand opening display be or become insecure or in danger of falling or otherwise unsafe in the opinion of the Building Inspector or Code Enforcement Officer, the owner thereof or person maintaining the same shall, upon receipt of written notice from the Building Inspector or Code Enforcement Officer and in any case within three days thereafter, secure the same in a manner to be approved by the Building Inspector or Code Enforcement Officer. If such order is not complied with, the Building Inspector or Code Enforcement Officer is hereby authorized to cause removal of such dangerous grand opening display; and any expense incident thereto shall be paid by the owner of the building, structure or premises on which such display is located. If such payment is not made, such expenses shall be assessed against the owner of the property to be levied against such property. Such amount shall be a lien on the property and collected at the same time and in the same manner as Town taxes. When any grand opening display is in such dangerous condition as to be

immediately dangerous to the safety of the public, the Building Inspector or Code Enforcement Officer is hereby authorized to take such actions as, in their opinion, shall be necessary to protect the public or property, including but not limited to the removal of such sign; and any expense incident thereto shall be paid by the owner of the sign.

- K. Gasoline station signs. Notwithstanding § 70-196J(1) and J(2) of this Article, the following signs, deemed customary and essential, shall be permitted as accessory to an existing gasoline station in any use district:
- (1) Signs which are an integral part of gasoline pumps.
- (2) Signs over bays, not to exceed two feet in height, containing the words "lubrication," "washing" or other similar customary words.
- (3) Signs showing the selling price of gasoline, not to exceed one such sign for each gasoline pump and attached thereto, and measuring not less than seven inches in height and eight inches in width nor more than 12 inches square.
- (4) Ground signs, not to exceed two in number, 24 square feet in area per sign face or 18 feet in height above the mean level of the ground, not to extend or project beyond any lot line.
- (5) Temporary signs, not to exceed two in number of 10 square feet per sign face; such signs shall advertise some special seasonal service and shall remain in view only during the periods October 1 to December 1 and/or April 1 to June 1.
- (6) Wall signs, in conformance with Subsection J(1).
- (7) The subject matter of any sign shall relate only to the business occupying the lot.
- L. Marquee sign, erected and maintained in connection with a hotel or theater, provided that such sign shall not exceed 15 inches in height nor extend beyond the permissible outer limits of said marquee nor be less than 10 feet above the mean level of the ground.
- M. Billboards or poster panels for hire shall be permitted only in industrial districts, provided that:
- (1) Only one such sign shall be permitted on the lot.
- (2) Such sign shall not exceed 15 feet in height from the top to the mean level of the ground.
- (3) Such sign shall not exceed 300 square feet in area.
- (4) There shall be not less than three feet of open space between the bottom of such sign and the ground surface.
- (5) Such sign shall be located at least 20 feet from any lot line and at least 50 feet from any residence district.

Section 3.

Chapter 70 of the Town Code is hereby amended as follows:

§ 70-197. Sign prohibitions.

A. No sign shall be erected on the roof of any building or structure, nor shall any part of a sign project higher than the roof line.

- B. No sign shall be painted on the surface of the walls or roofs of any building or structure.
- C. No sign shall be constructed of cloth, oil cloth, paper or other destructible material for display outside of any building except signs permitted under § 70-196F.
- D. No banners and/or pennants, <u>balloons or other gas-filled figures</u>, <u>advertising or message flags</u>, <u>bunting</u>, ribbons, streamers, spinners or other similar moving, fluttering or revolving devices constructed of cloth, oil cloth, paper, plastic, <u>nylon</u> or other destructible or indestructible material shall be erected or maintained across any street or attached to or upon any building or part thereof or upon any premises.

 [Amended 3-19-1974 by L.L. No. 4-1974]
- E. No sign or any part thereof, including lighting devices and reflectors, shall be placed so as to frame, [er] outline or hang from [two or more] any window, door or side[s] of any wall of a building, or prevent or inhibit free ingress to or egress from any door, window, fire escape or any required exit.
- F. No sign designed generally for the use of vertical lighting shall be erected.
- G. No sign which directs attention to a business, service, entertainment or commodity conducted, sold or offered, elsewhere than upon the premises shall be erected or maintained.
- H. No sign shall be attached to any tree[$\frac{1}{7}$] or fence [or utility pole].
- I. No sign shall be erected which directs, emits, radiates or reflects any beam, ray, gleam or glare of light away from the lot on which such sign is located.
- J. All signs which direct, emit, radiate or reflect any beam, ray, gleam or glare of light on an abutting residential district shall be extinguished within one-half (1/2) hour after the close of business and in no event later than 11:00 p.m. The close of business shall be deemed to be that time at which the premises are closed to the general public. Lights within business establishments may be kept on during the entire night, provided that the total amount of illumination does not exceed 20 footcandles.
- K. No sign shall be erected or maintained which might be confused as any traffic sign or which might interfere with the vision or discernment of any traffic sign or which might cause danger to public travel.
- L. Except as otherwise permitted in this ordinance, no sign shall be erected or maintained which extends or projects into any right-of-way.
- M. No sign, display or advertising device not heretofore classified in this Article shall be permitted in any use district.

- N. No sign shall be permitted within 500 feet of the border of any state park or parkway unless the applicant first complies with the appropriate provisions of the Conservation Law.
- O. [There shall be no moving parts or any] No flashing, blinking, rotating, changing, intermittent, animated or moving light or lights shall be permitted to constitute a part of any sign, including any sign or device on which the artificial light is not maintained stationary and constant in intensity and color at all times when in use. Time and temperature displays are not prohibited by this section, nor are message boards, provided that the message is not changed more than once per day. [varying illumination in connection therewith.] [Added 10-15-1968]
- P. No sign, including handbills and stickers, shall be affixed or attached to another sign, traffic signal, pole, controller cabinet or supporting structure, fire hydrant, bridge, streetlight, lamppost, or utility pole, within the right-of-way of any Town, state or county road or highway except when affixed or attached by, or with the written permission of, the governmental entity having jurisdiction over the location. Nothing herein shall be construed to prohibit any sign erected by, or with the express written permission of, the Town, county, state or other governmental authority or public utility having jurisdiction over the location, including any sign pertaining to traffic regulations, parking regulations and fire zones which are subject to the rules and regulations of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law.

§ 70-197.1 Rebuttable Presumption.

It shall be presumed that any person, business or entity identified on any sign, poster, sticker or advertising device regulated under this section, or the owner, agent, registrant, manager, business, entity or person in charge of any telephone number, website, entity, business or address identified on any sign, poster, sticker or advertising device regulated under § 70-197, is responsible for the placement of that sign, poster or sticker. This presumption shall be rebuttable.

Section 4.

Chapter 70 of the Town Code is hereby amended as follows:

§ 70-235 Penalties for offenses; additional fees for certain nonconforming structures.

[Amended 11-19-1974 by L.L. No. 11-1974; 8-18-1987 by L.L. No. 13-1987; 5-25-1993 by L.L. No. 5-1993; 8-27-1996 by L.L. No. 21-1996; 12-16-1997 by L.L. No. 24-1997] For any and every violation of the provisions of this chapter, the owner, general agent or contractor of a building or premises where such violation has been committed or shall exist, and the lessee or tenant of an entire building or entire premises where such violation has been committed or shall exist, and the owner, general agent, contractor,

lessee or tenant of any part of a building or premises in which part such violation has been committed or shall exist, and the general agent, architect, builder, contractor or any other person who knowingly commits, takes part in, allows or assists in any such violation or who maintains any part or assists in any such violation or who maintains any building or premises in which any such violation shall exist shall be guilty of a violation against this chapter and shall be punished as follows:

- A. For a violation of § 70-212 or 70-213, by a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$250 for conviction of a first offense; by a fine of not less than \$250 nor more than \$500 for conviction of the second of two offenses, both of which were committed within a period of five years; and by a fine of not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed 15 days, or both, for conviction of a third or subsequent offense of a series of offenses, all of which were committed within a period of five years. Each week's continued violation shall constitute a separate and distinct violation.
- B. For a violation of §§ 70-3.2, 70-3.3, 70-5, 70-5.1, 70-14, 70-15, 70-24, 70-25, 70-34, 70-35, 70-44, 70-45, 70-47, 70-54, 70-55, 70-57, 70-66, 70-67 or 70-69, by a fine of not less than \$1,000 nor more than \$2,500 or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed 15 days, or both, for conviction of a first offense; by a fine of not less than \$2,500 nor more than \$5,000 or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed 15 days, or both, for conviction of the second of two offenses, both of which were committed within a period of five years; and by a fine of not less than \$5,000 nor more than \$10,000 or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed 15 days, or both, for conviction of a third or subsequent offense of a series of offenses, of which were committed within a period of five years. Each week's continued violation shall constitute a separate and distinct violation.
- C. For a violation of § 70-229, by a fine of not less than \$250 nor more than \$1,500 or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed 15 days, or by both, for conviction of a first offense; by a fine of not less than \$1,500 nor more than \$5,000 or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed 15 days, or by both, for conviction of the second of two offenses, both of which were committed within a period of five years; and by a fine of not less than \$5,000 nor more than \$10,000 or by imprisonment or a period not to exceed 15 days, or by both, for conviction of the third or subsequent offense of a series of offenses, all of which were committed within a period of five years. Each week's continued violation shall constitute a separate and distinct violation.
- D. For a violation of § 70-222 of this chapter or any rule or regulation made pursuant thereto shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000, or by imprisonment of up to one year, or by both fine and imprisonment as hereinbefore set forth in this Subsection D. Each week's continued violation shall constitute a separate and distinct violation of said section or any rule or regulation made pursuant thereto. [Added 5-15-2003 by L.L. No. 5-2003]
- E. For a violation of §§ 70-202.2 and 70-202.3 of this chapter or any rule or regulation made pursuant thereto shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000, or by imprisonment of up to one year, or by both fine and imprisonment as hereinbefore set forth in this Subsection E. Each week's continued violation shall constitute a separate and distinct violation of said section or any rule or regulation made pursuant thereto. [Added 4-12-2005 by L.L. No. 2-2005]

- F. For a violation of §§ 70-173, 70-186, 70-187, 70-188, by a fine of not less than \$2,500 nor more than \$10,000 or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed 15 days, or by both, for conviction of a first offense; by a fine of not less than \$10,000 nor more than \$20,000 or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed 15 days, or by both, for conviction of the second of two offenses, both of which were committed within a period of five years; and by a fine of not less than \$20,000 nor more than \$30,000 or by imprisonment or a period not to exceed 15 days, or by both, for conviction of the third or subsequent offense of a series of offenses, all of which were committed within a period of five years. Each week's continued violation shall constitute a separate and distinct violation. [Added 9-24-2020 by L.L. No. 10-2020]
- G. For a violation of § 70-197 (P), by a fine of not less than \$250 nor more than \$1,500 or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed 15 days, or by both, for conviction of a first offense; by a fine of not less than \$1,500 nor more than \$5,000 or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed 15 days, or by both, for conviction of the second of two offenses, both of which were committed within a period of five years; and by a fine of not less than \$5,000 nor more than \$10,000 or by imprisonment or a period not to exceed 15 days, or by both, for conviction of the third or subsequent offense of a series of offenses, all of which were committed within a period of five years. Each week's continued violation shall constitute a separate and distinct violation.
- H. - (1) All building permit applications submitted on or after January 1, 2000, through and including December 31, 2006, which have received approval or authorization by

Building Department personnel, but are now deemed by the Building Department to be outside the scope of the Zoning Code, shall be hereby authorized for approval under the following circumstances and with the following conditions:

- (a) Square footage, setback, sky plane and height.
- [1] A structure not greater than 10% beyond the allowed square footage under the Zoning Code shall be deemed authorized on the condition that the applicant pay additional permit fees as set forth in the following schedule: \$170 per square foot, up to 6% beyond that allowed under the Zoning Code, plus an additional \$85 per square foot for each square foot greater than 6% and up to 10% of that allowed under the Zoning Code.
- [2] Setback: A structure that is 10% or less beyond the allowed setback under the Zoning Code shall be deemed authorized on the condition that the applicant pay an additional permit fee of \$1,500 per inch beyond the setback authorized under the Zoning Code.

- [4] Height: A structure that is not greater than 24 inches beyond the allowed height under the Zoning Code shall be deemed authorized on the condition that the applicant pay additional permit fees as set forth in the following schedule: \$5,000 per inch, up to 12 inches beyond the height authorized under the Zoning Code, plus an additional \$2,500 per inch for each inch greater than 12 inches and up to 24 inches beyond the height authorized under the Zoning Code.
- (b) All measurement calculations are to be set by the Building Department and shall be rounded upward for purposes of permit fee costs.
- (c) The Commissioner of the Building Department or his designee is hereby authorized to serve or cause to be served a written notification by regular mail and certified mail, return receipt requested, to the last known residential owner(s) of all known properties where building permit applications were submitted on or after January 1, 2000, through and including December 31, 2006, and which were issued certificates of occupancy by Building Department personnel, but are now deemed by the Building Department to violate the Zoning Code. Such written notification shall advise said owner(s) of the provisions of § 70-235H and shall advise of a date and time to be heard and afford an opportunity to reconcile the status of any nonconforming dwelling by satisfying the conditions and criteria required therein. Nothing stated herein shall preclude the owner of any premises that meets the foregoing description from submitting, without prior notification from the Town, an application to the Building Department pursuant to this article.

- (d) The Building Commissioner shall have the authority, after notice and an opportunity to be heard, to revoke any certificates of occupancy erroneously issued in connection with building permit applications submitted on or after January 1, 2000, through and including December 31, 2006, for properties now deemed by the Building Department to violate the Zoning Code. The Building Commissioner shall provide written notification to the owner prior to said revocation. Contemporaneously upon revocation, the Building Commissioner shall issue a restricted/limited certificate of occupancy that is annotated in such a manner as to provide any prospective purchaser with sufficient notice of the nonconforming zoning issues related to the subject property.
- (2) Property owners with building permit applications submitted prior to January 1, 2000, and subsequent to December 31, 2006, but are otherwise in conformance with the above-mentioned criteria, may apply to the Town Board to receive certification approval by requesting that the matter be heard by resolution before the Town Board. Such requests must be in writing and submitted to the Town's Building Commissioner. Matters that are presented to the Town Board pursuant to a resolution are subject to any conditions and/or additional fees set by the Town Board.

Section 5.

Chapter 70 of the Town Code is hereby amended as follows:

§ 70-236 Destruction of [advertising] devices within a Public Highway.

[Any] No person, corporation, association or other entity shall [who] willfully or maliciously displace[s], remove[s], destroy[s] or injure[s] a mileboard, milestone, danger sign or signal or guide sign, guidepost or street sign, or any other sign, or any inscription thereon, lawfully within the limits of any public highway, or [who] in any manner paint[s], print[s], place[s], put[s] or affix[es such] or cause to be painted, printed, placed or affixed any business, commercial or other advertisement or sign upon or to any rock, stone, tree, fence, stump, pole, mileboard, milestone, danger sign, danger signal, guide sign, guidepost, street sign, or any other sign, building, structure or other object lawfully within the limits of any public highway [, is guilty of a misdemeanor]. Any person, corporation, association or other entity who willfully or maliciously violates the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and be punishable in accordance with the penalties set forth in § 70-235(H).

MR. WINK: I'm now being asked -- Pete Gaffney has requested a right to comment.

MR. GAFFNRY: Yeah, Michael is one up on me. What I wanted to say is what I'd like you to include signage -- include the Town signage thefts. People sometimes in the area have been stealing stop signs and "no parking" and a few other things. So I think that should be included in the law as well, that's all.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Thank you for your comment.

MR. WINK: Okay. Item 10: A public hearing to consider the application of Galena Associates, LLC for a special use permit for the premises located at 780 Northern Boulevard, Great Neck, and designated on the Nassau County Land and Tax Map as Section 2, Block 108, Lots 24 through 29.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Councilwoman Lurvey -- I think Councilwoman Lurvey -- COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: Sorry. So this is a public hearing to consider the application for a special use permit and it includes -- the proposed action includes interior alterations and facade improvements for an existing auto repair shop on a .26 acre site. And I know that there are representatives of the applicant here who I believe are being promoted.

MR. LEVITT: That's correct. Andrew Levitt, how are you? Hope everything is doing well. I want to make sure my team is on. I have Mr. Reilly, Mr. Eschbacher, Mr. Marx and Mr. Ferry.

MR. WINK: I don't see the last two gentlemen yet.

MR. LEVITT: I don't see Bob Marx yet. I see Mr. Ferry, I don't see Mr. Marx yet.

MR. WINK: Okay, thank you.

MR. LEVITT: Madame Supervisor, Town Board, may I begin?

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Yes, please.

MR. LEVITT: Good evening, Supervisor Bosworth, members of the Town Board. My name is Andrew Levitt with offices at 535 Broad Hollow Road, Suite 830, Melville, New York 11747. I represent the applicant Galena Associates, LLC who operates the Valvoline Instant Oil Change. The applicant's premises is situated in the Business A Zoning District and improved with a commercial building known as 780 Northern Boulevard, Great Neck, New York, and further identified on the Nassau County Land and Tax Map as Section 2, Block 108, Lots 24 through 29. The applicant who has owned the building since 1997 is seeking to maintain the existing automobile service station. The building was used as a gasoline service station in 1951 and subsequently converted for auto loop use.

On March 3rd, 2021, the Board of Zoning Appeals, under Appeal No. 20994, granted the applicant a parking variance and variances for a wall sign and ground sign. The applicant is seeking a special use permit and permission under the Town Code to continue to maintain the premises for automobile service station. As will be explained by John Reilly, principal architect of JMR, the applicant is seeking permission to improve the facade, make all interior alterations, replace the wall sign and resurface the pylon sign. Further, the applicant's traffic engineer, Robert Eschbacher, VHB, will testify that the existing use shall not create traffic congestion or traffic hazard; and such use will not cause any significant increase in the activity level at the site so that the parking demand will not increase. Moreover, the applicant's real estate expert, Robert Marx, will testify to the Board that the use of the building as Valvoline Instant Oil Change is consistent with the pattern of commercial development in the area and the current use and existing sign shall not have an adverse impact upon the committee. Before I call John Reilly to discuss the plans that were submitted as part of this application, the applicant intends upon improving the site with landscaping and will coordinate such improvements with the New York State Department of Transportation and the plane department when the applicant submits its application to the New York State Department of Transportation to erect a sidewalk in the rightof-way. I just want to make the Board aware that Michael Ferry, who is present, is the principal member of the applicant, Galena Associates, and is here to answer any questions that the Board might have as we go through the presentation. At this point, with your permission, I'd like to call John Reilly our architect.

MR. REILLY: Good evening, Supervisor, members of the Board.

This is an existing automotive service center, performing primarily oil changes and minor maintenance. On the drawing Al that I submitted, I showed the existing floor plan which is labeled Detail 1 and shows a three-bay service area with a separate office and waiting area in its current configuration. The Detail 2 at the bottom of Al on the same drawing shows the proposed construction to renovate the waiting area and provide a fully ADA-compliant restroom, as well as a separate employee restroom. A small business office will also be provided for the manager of the facility. On drawing A2, we show the proposed exterior renovation plan to accommodate Valvoline's current design branding and sign. A color rendering of the drawings was provided to the Board. Drawing A3 shows the proposed refacing of the existing pylon sign with Valvoline's current logo and sign. There are typically four employees on-site; there is one employee for each

of the three service bays and a manager who oversees the entire center's operation.

The business is set up as a drive-thru automotive service center. The average service time is approximately 18 minutes. The patrons are encouraged to remain in the car as well as servicing takes place. There is a waiting room available for patrons who should they desire to remain out of the car during servicing. My drawing SP1, which is the site plan, shows a proposed parking and traffic circulation through the site. Our traffic expert, Bob Eschbacher from VHB, will elaborate on the traffic and parking in his testimony. That concludes my presentation.

MR. LEVITT: Unless there are any other questions for Mr. Reilly, I'd like to call Robert Eschbacher of VHB to testify and ask the Board recognize him as a traffic expert.

MR. ESCHBACHER: Good evening, Supervisor Bosworth and members of the Town Board. My name is Robert Eschbacher with VHB Engineering. My office is located at 100 Motor parkway in Hauppauge. I was retained by the applicant to review the traffic engineering aspects of this project. My study included a review of the site plan, evaluation of the site access and internal circulation, review of the site distance and visibility for the driveways and an evaluation of the parking adequacy. At the outset, it's important to recognize that this business already exists and will continue to operate as it has in the past and will continue to operate in a satisfactory manner. With respect to the site access, the existing access for the site will not change. The two curb cuts, one on the westerly side for entering vehicles and one on the east side for exiting vehicles, will continue. Regarding the on-site circulation, the basic traffic flow pattern will remain. Cars enter the site on the westerly curb cut and then drive around to the rear of the site and then when an opening is available in one of the service bays, they pull into that.

period, but there is a small waiting room and restroom which can be used if necessary.

After the servicing is complete, the vehicles pull forward through the bay and then proceed to the exit driveway, which is controlled by a traffic signal on Northern Boulevard.

Generally, as Mr. Reilly indicated, the customers remain in the car, especially during the Covid

As requested by the Town's planning department, we will be coordinating with New York State DOT to provide a formal sidewalk within the state right-of-way which will be an improvement over the current, unstriped asphalt pavement area. And this will provide for very convenient access for pedestrians crossing over the frontage along Northern Boulevard.

Regarding parking, I testified before the Board of Zoning Appeals, which subsequently approved the necessary variances, that there will continue to be sufficient parking, especially considering that formal striped parking spaces are not needed for the customers, they remain in the car, they don't park elsewhere on the site. And they remain in the car and move through the site. Therefore, the real need for parking is for the employees and the adequate parking has been provided for them as shown on the site plan. In conclusion, it is my professional opinion that the proposed renovations to this existing site will not result in any negative impacts to local traffic and parking conditions or to the safety. And the project complies with the Town's standards for special use permits. I recommend that the Town Board approve this project. Thank you.

COUNCIL WOMAN LURVEY: Thank you, Mr. Eschbacher.

MR. LEVITT: Councilwoman, do you have a question?

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: No.

MR. LEVITT: I apologize.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: It is Councilwoman Lurvey who is running this hearing.

MR. LEVITT: Sorry, Supervisor.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: We work well together.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: We do.

COUNCIL WOMAN LURVEY: I was just going to ask if that's the end of your presentation?

MR. LEVITT: No, it's not. I have Mr. Marx who is our real estate expert and I ask the Board to qualify him as a real estate expert.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: Mr. Marx.

MR. MARX: My name is Robert Marx, I have been testifying before the Board of Zoning Appeals and Town Board of North Hempstead since 1970. My office is located at 3 Kettle Court in East Hampton, New York and I work under the name of Robert Marx, Incorporated. I have been retained by the applicant to offer my real estate opinion and I have visited the site many times. The subject has been located for over 30 years on Northern Boulevard in Great Neck. Northern Boulevard, as you all know, has tenancies of office buildings, restaurants, shopping centers, auto dealers and auto-related businesses. Abutting the subject is a tire store and a car wash. Across the street is Morton's Steakhouse and Biener Audi Dealership. As I said, the applicant has been doing business at this location for over 30 years. Before that, it was a gas station since the 1950s. This use, considered auto-related, is consistent with the character of the neighborhood. The existing and proposed use is of such size, location, design and site layout as to be appropriate and in harmony with the surrounding properties.

The existing and proposed use has and will provide a desirable service and convenience to the area and contributes to the proper growth and development of the community and its general welfare. Again, the existing and proposed use is not objectionable to nearby residential buildings or dwellings by reason of noise, light, vibration or other factors of input. The existing and proposed use has been and will continue to be a harmonious use in the district and has not and will not hinder or discourage the appropriate use of adjacent property development, nor has it nor will it impair the values of properties nearby. Thank you.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: Thank you, Mr. Marx.

MR. LEVITT: That now concludes my presentation unless any of the members of the Board have any questions. Mr. Ferry is also here to answer any questions as well.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: So I thank you for your presentation, I know the area well. I have reviewed your documentation, I know of no community objections. And I would like, unless the anybody on the Town Board has any questions. Mr. Wink, is there anybody who wishes to speak?

MR. WINK: I have no one requesting the right to comment.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: So I would like Mr. Levine, please, to give us your thoughts. COMMISSIONER LEVINE: Certainly. This is a fairly straightforward application. The one item we noted and it was alluded to by both Mr. Levitt and Mr. Eschbacker, we first noticed that sometime ago there was an encroachment into the state right-of-way and the sidewalk was paved over. We couldn't establish an exact year, we just know it was a long time ago, possibly even predating Valvoline's involvement with the site. So standard protocol when we see that, we contact state department of transportation to confirm whether there was or wasn't any prior permit or permission of the encroachment. There wasn't. They recommend that the sidewalk be restored and so we're carrying on that recommendation. Also DOT has the specifications, if it hasn't already been done, we'll set the applicant and the state contact up in communication with each other. So with that one condition, that the right-of-way be restored to its original condition, we recommend approval.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: Thank you, Commissioner Levine. I know that this area, that sidewalk, was not there and so I think that is a great step to take. I would like to, unless anybody has anything to say, I'd like to close the public hearing, offer the resolution approving the special use permit and move for its adoption.
