PROCEEDINGS

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Good evening, everybody. If you could please find your seats. And now I'm going to ask you to please rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

(Pledge of Allegiance.)

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Thank you. Mr. Wink, could you please call the meeting to order?

MR. WINK: Town of North Hempstead Board meeting Thursday, September 2nd, 2021.
Councilwoman Dalimonte.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Here.

MR. WINK: Councilman Ferrara.

COUNCILMAN FERRARA: Here.

MR. WINK: Councilwoman Lurvey.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: Here.

MR. WINK: Councilwoman Russell.

COUNCILWOMAN RUSSELL: Here.

MR. WINK: Councilwoman Seeman.

COUNCILWOMAN SEEMAN: Here.

MR. WINK: Councilman Zuckerman.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Here.

MR. WINK: Supervisor Bosworth.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Here. So before we start our open comment period, I'd just like to mention that we're going into the Labor Day weekend and I think this year especially we need to be so grateful to all the men and women who served by their labor, by working, by representing us, by helping us here at the Town and throughout our country. And if there was ever an example of their really incredible work ethic, it was during this storm that was -- we knew it was going to rain, but no one knew that it was going to rain with three inches of rainfall per hour and our highway crews and our park crews were out there really all night. They were called in again at six in the morning, they've been working straight through. I know unfortunately so many people did experience flooding and more than that. So as we enter the Labor Day weekend, let's make sure, especially on Monday, Labor Day, that we give thought to the tremendous work that our work force here at the Town has done for us every day and especially these last few days. And we are grateful to the workers who really are at the heart of this nation, who built this nation and Labor Day is really a day to commemorate their great work. So just wanted to say that. Okay. So following our Town Board procedure, we'll now open the meeting with thirty minutes of public comments on any matters not having to do with items on the agenda.

(Whereupon, the following was off the record.)

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Please strike Item 34 and begin tonight's agenda.

MR. WINK: Continuations, item 1, a public hearing to consider the application of Carolyn

Bichoupan for an appeal from a disapproval by the Commissioner of Building Safety, Inspection and Enforcement of a structure (dock) application pursuant to Chapter 42 of the Town Code for the property located at 4 Waters Edge, Port Washington, New York and identified on the Nassau County Land and Tax Map as Section 5, Block C, Lot 444.

MR. BICHOU PAN: Good evening, my name is Robert Bichoupan. I live at 4 Waters Edge, Port Washington. My wife, Carolyn, is the homeowner. We're applying for a variance on a dock. We spoke two meetings ago. I've learned a couple of things since then.

COUNCILMAN FERRERA: Can you speak into the microphone, please?

MR. BICHOU PAN: Yeah. So I have some additional information that I learned since we last spoke. There are a couple of DEC requirements that pertain to the application. The first is that the dock, where it joins the bulkhead, must be in the middle third of our property. The second is that the floats, the floating docks, need to be in a minimum of three feet of water at low tide and the boat also has to be at a minimum of three feet at low tide. Those are DEC requirements according to my engineer. Anybody who buys a house on the water has literal rights, so we have some rights to build this dock. The Town raised several objections. I handed out a drawing. It's not submitted formally. This is just so it's easier for you to conceptualize what we did since we last spoke. We met with the neighbors, had a very pleasant conversation and I tried to incorporate some of their comments. One request was from Ms. Tito who's a neighbor to our north immediately adjacent to our house and she requested that --

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Can you shut the door, please?

MR. BICHOU PAN: She requested that the point at which the dock meets the bulkhead be moved as far away from her property as possible and with this drawing, which I hope will be submitted shortly -- more formally. What this shows it's all the way to the south side of that third, that middle third of our property that's required by the DEC. Before it was on the north end of that one third piece, now it's on the south end to accommodate Ms. Tito's comment. The drawings accommodate the requirement to adjust the height of the dock, to adjust the height of the railings. Those are, you know, what the Town wants. That's what we're going to do. So at this point, we're left with just a couple of issues. The length obviously, but the length was adjusted. We reduced the length by 20 feet which is the most I can reduce it to keep me in that three feet of water at minimum low tide. We -- as I said, we moved the dock over. We have a new neighbor who's here tonight and he has indicated -- and I believe he's going to speak for himself -- that he's amenable to us encroaching onto the 15-foot setback on this side. So what this drawing shows is that we are no longer encroaching the 15-foot setback on Ms. Tito's side at all except for two piles. The piles are set a little further towards the center of our property, a little further away from her property, but the prevailing winds and tide from the waves from the harbor mouth come at us from the northwest. And, unfortunately, any time there's wind, we get battered and these piles are required to keep the boat off the dock, so as to prevent damage to the boat and the dock. It's a safety measure. Other than that, we're completely off the 15-foot setback on her side. We moved it entirely onto the other neighbor's 15-foot setback and I'll let him speak for himself. The other variance we're requesting is an eight-foot wide dock as opposed to a six-foot wide dock. At that distance, the visual impact is almost nothing. The docks to both sides of us, to the north and the south which go out at least 50 feet further than the proposed dock, have on one side an eight foot and the other side a 12-foot wide dock. The one to the south is the yacht club. We're not asking for anything more than our neighbor's have. They also have wider docks

because of the safety issues. Again, the prevailing winds and waves cause a good bit of rocking. A six-foot wide dock is just going to be a lot less stable for people walking on it. So we're asking for that. Otherwise everything that was raised is being addressed to the requirements of the Town. And although we are allegedly entitled to some kind of water rights, we are here asking for a variance. But I do see in Section 42-11 of the Town Code that if the record indicates to your satisfaction the strict application of the provision, the 150-foot maximum is what you guys have. If the strict application of the provisions is not necessary to maintain safe, navigability of the water way or to prevent undo interference with the right of the public to use the waterfront for the literal rights of the adjacent waterfront property owners, you have the right to grant our variance. We're not asking for anything crazy. We bought this house specifically because we intended to put a dock in. If we knew that it was going to be such a challenge, I don't know that we would have bought this house. We're hoping to retire in place here and the dock is part of that. All we're asking for is to get to now three feet of water which is a minimum DEC requirement, not an inch more. So having said that, I don't know if you want to say anything.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Is your engineer here?

MR. BICHOU PAN: Sorry?

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Is your engineer here?

MR. BICHOU PAN: Is my engineer -- no, my engineer is not here. I can have him here at the next meeting when we submit the actual plans. I was hoping for some feedback from you, from whoever wants to comment, so I can see if I can make any further changes before I finally submit it. I'm trying to make as many --

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: But this is the hearing, so it is the final -- it is the submission.

MR. BICHOU PAN: We haven't submitted the amendment because I couldn't get it from my engineer in time.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Okay. But that was the problem with us because here we are having the hearing and I didn't have the revised plans to review them.

MR. BICHOU PAN: I got this today and I'm giving you what I got today. That's the best I can do. I will have it done by the next meeting.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: But I am letting you know that the Waterfront Advisory Committee advised me to -- they advised the board not to approve this application because of the 15-foot setback. You can't take it from one neighbor and put onto another neighbor. That's not -- I don't even care if he says yes. That cannot happen. So if that's going to stay the way it is -- are you submitting these plans tonight?

MR. BICHOU PAN: I don't have the plans redone. I have to have them completely redone, but it's impossible --

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: But are you saying that's what's going to happen?

MR. BICHOU PAN: It's impossible to accommodate not encroaching the 15-foot setback and get to three feet of water.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: That's why if we are going to take a vote tonight, my vote is going to be no because it has to be 15 feet. He can not -- you cannot have somebody sitting in

their dining room or their kitchen table eating and then someone on their deck could see right into their apartment and that's why there is a requirement for 15 feet. And the Waterfront Advisory Committee that advises the Town Board has told us to be voting no on this dock because of that. So if you're going to just take it from one neighbor and push it off to another neighbor, I'm not -- it's not going to work.

MR. BICHOUPAN: So what is this language about a reasonable accommodation if it doesn't impact the navigable waterways?

COUNCIL WOMAN DALIMONTE: Well, I'm -- we reviewed it. If you want the Waterfront Advisory Committee to refuse your -- review your new plans, I need them submitted tomorrow, so I can have them review them, see what they agree with. But I'm letting you know that they are very strict on that 15-foot setback.

MR. BICHOUPAN: We're going out of town tomorrow. Can I have one week?

COUNCIL WOMAN DALIMONTE: You can have one week. One week is -- I mean, let's see.

MR. BICHOUPAN: Can I have until Friday?

COUNCIL WOMAN DALIMONTE: Okay. So you're going out the town tomorrow. You will submit them on the 13th.

MR. BICHOUPAN: What's Friday of next week?

COUNCIL WOMAN DALIMONTE: Friday of next week's the tenth.

MR. BICHOUPAN: So the 13th?

COUNCIL WOMAN DALIMONTE: The 13th is absolutely fine, but I'm not -- I will have to continue this, but I'm not continuing it until -- what's the meeting after September 30?

MR. WINK: October 7.

COUNCIL WOMAN DALIMONTE: October 7. Because the Waterfront Advisory Committee is meeting on Monday, September 27th. So I will -- and then the Board Meeting is that 30th. It's too close, so I would have to -- you would be on the board -- the Town Board agenda on the 7th.

MR. BICHOUPAN: October 7th?

COUNCIL WOMAN DALIMONTE: Yes, October 7th.

MR. BICHOUPAN: So that's the next meeting?

COUNCIL WOMAN DALIMONTE: That -- you're not going to be on the next meeting. You're going to be on the following week.

MR. BICHOUPAN: So we're back here October 7th. I need to resubmit by the 13th of this month.

COUNCIL WOMAN DALIMONTE: I mean -- right because I would like -- and it has to be an electronic copy, so I can send it to them 'cause this is too hard to read.

MR. BICHOUPAN: This is what I got today. I did my best.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: So councilwoman, is it possible for it to be a later date? I mean, the --

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: If they want to do it later, but I would think they --

MR. BICHOU PAN: No, I think we're at the end. I don't know what else to do here. The only way to get to above the three feet is with you guys giving us a variance. The DEC won't let me do it in three feet of water and you're saying I can't cross the 15 feet. I'm not sure how to do this. It seems to be impossible.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Well, where you bought your house down there, those houses are very, very close. Usually when someone's on the water, they have more frontage and I have received objection letters to your dock.

MR. BICHOU PAN: I think the people who objected are here, but maybe they have something to say, but the problem is not the frontage.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: They haven't sent letters of support.

MR. BICHOU PAN: It's that the property comes to a point and that's the problem. It's not the frontage. I have enough frontage.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Right. So is there any -- are you done with your presentation? Is there anyone here from the public who would like to speak?

MR. WINK: I have two additional cards, councilwoman.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Thank you.

MR. BICHOU PAN: Thank you.

MR. WINK: First of which is John Armentano.

MR. ARMENTANO: Good evening, Madame Supervisor, members of the board. My name is John Armentano. I'm an attorney with Farrell Fritz who represent Mr. And Mrs. Tito who live directly north of the subject property at 6A South Court in Port Washington. We also just received this revision, so I agree with you that there is little to no -- nothing that can be done tonight with regard to this. However, we were just retained also on Friday of last week to come up to speed on this matter. Just really briefly -- and I'll keep my comments brief. You know, just looking at this application and what has been resubmitted, you know, I do a lot of waterfront work, I do represent property owners on the waterfront, so I'm very versed on the rights as I'm sure the board is as well. And one issue that we did have was trying to get information before the hearing. It was very difficult to get this information and I would really like to also have either the electronic copies or what have you that is being resubmitted, so that we can evaluate the situation that my client. I'll leave my business card, so we can --

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: I'm going to have our town attorney speak. Amanda, could you speak on that point? So he went --he did a FOIL request and he did not receive per Len. You have to do a FOIL request in order to receive everything. They're just not receiving it in a timely fashion for them to review for the hearing.

MS. ABATA: Hi, this is -- my name's Amanda. I'm the Chief Deputy Town Attorney. With regards to your FOIL request, you submitted a FOIL request, but you said you're not receiving it in a timely fashion to review for the hearing?

MR. ARMENTANO: Correct. In my understanding, we are the adjoining property owner. We have the right to see the application before the hearing. I should not be going through the 2 0-

day FOIL process. It should be -- I mean, I do this for a living. I represent municipalities. I should, as an applicant for a neighboring property owner, be able to see that application before the hearing. I still have not seen information and that should be provided to me basically on the day that I was asking for it because the public notice says that the application tier was here. I understand there was a delay. It's just really --

MS. ABATA: But you've already filled out the FOIL?

MR. ARMENTANO: I did.

MS. ABATA: All right. So what I can do for you is to work on expediting that, you know, once - the re-submittal so that you can get it quicker than you have been.

MR. ARMENTANO: That's fine. I appreciate it. We'd really like to see the Waterfront Advisory Committee's report. To me, that is a valuable document.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: So I understand that and I believe that you reached out to me and I brought it to our town attorney and I was told that you have to FOIL everything. So I'm very sorry.

MR. ARMENTANO: No, I appreciate it. Listen, we're here tonight and I can catch up to --It's something I can catch up with, but I do think we need to have a transparency of the information. You know, there were comments being made that he is --there's not an actual right to a dock; it's reasonable access to the waterway. The fact that we have converging lines here is a big problem. We do appreciate that it was moved south, but the issue still from our peering perspective is the mooring piles are directly on our line. And if you look at the new submission, two things that are very apparent is that one -- and I'm not an engineer and we are going to want to retain one as well, but the soundings which are the depth to water are showing the middle of his floating dock to be negative four, so that's the depth of four feet. So he has not -- he is beyond the three-foot minimum. The length of dock here is excessive. You should only have the right to reach the three feet minimum as is required by the DEC and the Town Code. So exceeding this is only based on his need for a larger boat. That's not a right. You can't park the Queen of Mary in front of your house because you don't have a right to do that. You have a right to reasonable access. Reasonable access should be minimized to the extent you need to reach navigable water which is three feet. This plan as we have seen just submitted today and the plan that was previously submitted far exceeds that minimum depth requirement. Again, you have length as dictated by the water depth and the addition of the eight-foot-wide float is also in violation of the Town Code. Again, he's pushing himself further out claiming that he is not going to be in unstable water. If you shorten the length of the dock, he is in a protected cove. I mean, there are two boat marines in there. There is no need for this width of dock. That's a variance that should not be granted for this application. Again, I think this is more of a need than a want. It's a self-created hardship which I know the board must weigh closely and heavily, you know, our issues again while we appreciate that it has been pivoted away from our side yard, the mooring piles are directly on line with -- and completely within our 16-foot setback. That also has to be addressed. I'm just bringing this to the board's attention as I know the councilwoman is aware. We would like to be able to comment as I'm sure we will be able to at the next hearing. So again, I think this is really a repackaging of the same thing with minor tweaks. I think there has to be an overhaul of this proposal to make it reasonable. I mean, we are also waterfront owners. We have rights as well. You know, you are setting -- you could set a poor precedent here if you grant the size of this dock in this location because there are several other homes that could proliferate their

own docks, that you could run out -- this whole area of the cove could all have docks at this length and I don't think that's good planning for this waterfront area. I think there should be a hard look at the length of the dock. The minimum should be to reach the three-foot water depth and from there, I think you base where the rest of this application profits in. So I do appreciate your time and these are our comments for now. We'd obviously like an opportunity to speak at the next hearing.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: And you if you don't mind giving Amanda your business card.

MR. BICHOU PAN: Can I just respond to a couple of things -- the couple of misstatements? I just want to make sure the record is clear. The depth on the drawing which I submitted -- which is not a formal submission. I explained I was handing it out just so you could follow what I was saying tonight. It's not intended to be a formal submission. The depth on this and prior drawings -- there's two depths on each line. One depth is your average low tide and the other depth is your extreme low tide. And the three-foot depth we're talking about is the extreme low tide event. That's what will damage the boat, so if you look at the drawing, you'll note it's three foot at the point of the floating dock closest to our property. We really took it to the inch. And the two piles are not on the line. We've moved them in because of the shortening of the dock as much as we could. And again, I'll repeat although it is a variance for a longer dock, both docks on either side of us are substantially longer, at least 50 feet longer, on either side of us. We're not creating a new long dock where none existed. We're actually substantially shorter than the docks on either side of us. So I just wanted to clarify those couple of points. Thank you.

MR. WINK: We have an additional card from Daniel Freedman.

MR. FREEDMAN: Thank you. I'm a resident, a new resident at 3 Waters Edge which is just south of 4 Waters Edge and I'm here to express that I'm -- it seems to me a trivial variance that he's asking for. I'm happy to accommodate him at least on my side of the setback lines. It's his dream to have a dock. I don't want to stand in the way of someone's dreams and like I said it's a couple of feet and I'm happy to accommodate him, so he can have a dock. Thank you very much.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: So I'm happy to announce that we have received a lot of input regarding the proposed tree codes and policy. It's clear that trees are important to the residents of the Town of North Hempstead whether it's for their aesthetic value, their environmental impacts, their effects on our health and wellbeing, their role in providing a habitat for wildlife, the cooling provided by their shade, their carbon capture stone water run-off mitigation and more. I have been known to talk about this for hours and nobody wants me to do that tonight. There's been many comments coming in over the past couple of days. We're working on responding to them. We're working hard. In order to give us more time to respond to the outstanding comments from our fellow Town Board members as well, I will be moving to continue the hearing to the September 30th Town Board meeting. Mr. Wink, are there any comments?

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: The adoption of this ordinance will establish No Stopping Here to Corner restrictions on the north side of Allenwood Road, west of Warwick Road in Great Neck. Based on feedback from residents living in the area, we determined with the advice of the Town's traffic engineer that the length of the No Stopping Here to Corner needs to be adjusted. Therefore, I will be moving to continue this hearing without a date; however, I will be setting a set date in item 17. With that said, I offer the resolution and move to continue the hearing without a date.

COUNCILMAN FERRERA: The rescission and adoption of these ordinances will eliminate the presently posted one hour parking restriction and add No Parking restrictions on portions of the west and east sides of First Avenue, between Railroad Avenue and Dennis Street, in Garden City Park. Anyone wishing to be heard?

MR. WINK: I have no cards on this item, Councilman.

COUNCILMAN FERRERA: Seeing no one, I'd like to close the public hearing, offer the resolution and move for its adoption.

MR. WINK: Item 7, a public hearing to consider the adoption of ordinances affecting Waldo Avenue in Greenvale, New York.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: The adoption of these ordinances will establish No Stopping anytime restrictions on the north and south sides of Waldo Avenue, between Glen Cove Road and 1st Street, in Greenvale, but that doesn't really describe the entire situation. So the situation here is that at the intersection of Waldo Avenue and Glen Cove Road on that very corner, there is a yogurt store. And patrons of that yogurt store and possibly the Dunkin' Donuts around the corner are parking right in front of the yogurt store, essentially blocking the egress and the ability of residents to come and go in that area. We've had several discussions with many residents. We had a conference call, which was really wonderful where we talked with the residents and we talked about various ways to improve it. And then with the help of, I would say our block liaison, Andrew Machinski, he set up an onsite -- who's here tonight and I know he wants to talk. After I speak, I'll have you weigh in. We had an onsite meeting. At that onsite meeting, I would say we had about 50 to 60 people at that meeting and at that meeting, we discussed the various way that we at the Town of North Hempstead can try to help this situation. Also in attendance at that meeting is our traffic engineer, as well as Shawn Brown and Mark and my legislative aid. So at the advice -- based on the advice of our traffic engineer, these are the traffic and safety measures that -- measures that are included in tonight's item. So we're talking about two sides of the street. The north side of the street which is closest to the yogurt store. On the north side of the street, we're installing two new No Stopping signs -- we're installing two new No Stopping signs. In addition to that, we're putting No Stopping anytime from a point of 20 foot from each curb line east of 105 feet. In addition to that, we're painting the curb along the north side in front of the yogurt store, so that everyone will be able to see it's yellow. So they'll know and it'll say no parking. In addition to that, in front of the yogurt store on the north side of Waldo as you would enter, we're installing white new pavement strippings in the road, so it'll be obvious to everyone there that you cannot park there. Additionally, we met with the owner of the yogurt store and he agreed and has taken down a parking sign with an arrow that was pointing to that very spot. Now we're not stopping there. Now on the south side of the street on Waldo, we're installing two new No Stopping signs in addition to keeping the ones that are in existence. We're also painting the curb on the south side yellow. We're adding No Stopping anytime from a point of 20 feet east of the curb line and east from a distance of 120 feet. There is a gas station at that point and we're putting more additional No Stopping signs there where the curb cuts are, so that individuals cannot park there. Now we're doing all of this and it's terrific and we're working together with the community and we're hopeful that this will help and we're committed to that. And if something -- if this doesn't work, you know, we're willing to go back to the drawing board certainly. But enforcement is a major part in this and I can tell you my office and the supervisor's office have been communicating with the Nassau County Police Department and they've assured us that they would monitor the area and maintain the traffic and safety regulations, so that everyone in that neighborhood is safe. Andy has spoken to -- I put him in touch with the pop officer Villchez and in addition to that, it's the -- Inspector Begis from the 6th Precinct has also weighed in on this with us and spoken with Andy, myself and weighed in with the supervisor's office and everyone is committed to trying to make this better. Additionally, our code enforcement people, Shawn Brown, he is here tonight. He has communicated with Andy and we've issued half of all these violations that we've issued in Greenvale for the year in this very location. So we're all committed to doing this and again, tonight we're intending to -- it's our intention to pass these traffic and safety measures to make things better, but we realize that it is a

work in progress, whether it's enforcement or these particular safety and traffic regulations, which we are proposing tonight. And I know there's a few cards. Andy, would you like to come up and say a couple of words, please?

MR. MACHINSKI: Please and I know there's -- my neighbors in the neighborhood are here and I do have a couple of things I would like to say. First of all --

MR. WINK: Can I ask you to identify yourself for the record?

MR. MACHINSKI: I'm sorry, Mr. Wink. My name is Andy Machinski. I live at 3rd Street in Greenvale.

MR. WINK: And also I'm going to ask you to keep your comments under three minutes.

MR. MACHINSKI: Absolutely, sir. First of all, I'd like to just reemphasize what Ms. Bosworth said at the beginning of the meeting of the hard work. Last evening of her crew here at the Town of North Hempstead. I would personally like to recognize this gentleman here from the 6th Precinct and all the 6th Precinct officers as well as my fellow firefighters. Last night in Roslyn, we responded to over 40 alarms in the span of three hours, rescuing people from -- trapped in floods in their cars, trees on houses, as well as my fellow firefighters in Port Washington who answered a second alarm fire last night during all of that as well.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: So I'm just going to say thank you for your service and for all that you have done and for all that our great people from the 6th Precinct have done.

MR. MACHINSKI: I'm not looking for thanks, but thank you.

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Well, thank you.

MR. MACHINSKI: Thank you, ma'am. I appreciate all the efforts that Peter has put forward and I just wanted to reiterate. I know I've been communicating with Peter almost daily through email, trying to emphasize the fact that this is a very serious and safety issue and I know everybody knows it, but I -- one thing which a neighbor brought up is that this entrance to our neighborhood is basically our driveway. I know it's not our personal driveway, but it's a personal driveway to everybody that lives in that neighborhood because it is -- you have Waldo Avenue, which goes down and to make it easy, it's like the letter E. You have First Street, Second Street, Third Street and it runs off of Waldo Avenue, 1, 2, 3. Okay. So this entrance to Waldo Avenue is the only way that, you know, 60 or some odd homes can get in and out of their residence and in and out of homes. There's numerous times that we've pulled into the block and have had to wait on Glen Cove Road with traffic bearing down on us traveling in a northern direction, numerous times that we've almost hit people coming out of their cars who were illegally parked. So not only is it dangerous for us, it's also dangerous for the people who are illegally parking. And God forbid that, you know, numerous times that we've been there, I've done it myself, numerous other neighbors have said, you know, you're parked illegally, you know, and you get all kinds of four-letter words, hand gestures and the like. I was -- what brought this to a head was I was spit at back in March and this has been going on for the 24 years that I've been living there. And again, I know I've been communicating very extensively with Peter. We feel that, you know, the only way that's going to happen --and we appreciate all the efforts and the extra parking signs --is the presence of the PD, the presence of the code enforcement and the issuance of summonses is the only way that these people who are doing this are going to get the message. In addition to that, just getting back to the public safety issue, in that particular neighborhood we have seven, seven firefighters who need to get out at various times of the day or night. There's two in my house,

myself and my son. There's a gentleman around the corner. So there's seven of us and numerous times it's difficult to get out to respond to the firehouses to get to alarms. So not only is it an issue for here, it's an issue for -- and a safety issue for the greater community of Roslyn and the areas that we protect as firefighters. And again, I really appreciate the efforts of Mr. Zuckerman and everybody else who is working very hard on this, my neighbors as well. But if we could see some more summons issued, I think that would make us very, very happy and that's all I have to say. Thank you very much for everything and thank you for your time.

SPEAKER: I would like to come up and say something. Am I allowed to do that?

MR. WINK: What I'm going to ask you to do is, if you wait a few minutes, Ms. Licarri (phonetic) who submitted a card asked to speak and then you can come up and make your comments after.

SPEAKER: Oh, wonderful.

MS. LICARRI: Hi

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Hi, Ms. Licarri, thank you for being here.

MS. LICARRI: Yes, thank you. Well, Andy really spoke about, you know, everything we've said and Councilman Zuckerman has been very, very helpful and I think the meeting that we had on our corner was very informative. I think we all learned a lot as well. You were all standing there on the corner, I think and the code enforcement gentleman was there. There was actually three or four cars that they had to knock on their windows and say hey, you can't park here because this is an ongoing problem. And it is a blind corner coming down that street and when the rear end of your car is stuck in Glen Cove Road, it's an extremely dangerous situation. When we come down there with our car and when we try to get up, we can't move. So I think the changes that you suggested, the No Parking on the right side by the gas station -- which is actually the north side, not the southside -- will really, really help the situation. And they're painting the curb yellow -- we had discussed painting it red. Was that not possible?

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Our traffic engineer said that we were not able to do that pursuant to New York State.

MS. LICARRI: Oh, okay. Okay. So we'll try the yellow. We'll see how it goes.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Let's try it.

MS. LICARRI: And the stripes. I think the stripes should be very helpful, too.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: I think you've seen the stripes. You see it when you enter and exit a highway, it's similar to that.

MS. LICARRI: Yes. And do they -- did they even address the idea of a possible -- Laura had suggested -- she's not here today, but possibly putting up some kind of a fence or something over there.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: She suggested a metal guard rail.

MS. LICARRI: Yeah.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: But again, our traffic engineer was against that because he felt that it was a safety issue that could be compromised with respect to potential traffic whether it was the vehicles or pedestrians, but let me say this. We're trying -- I mean, I read you the list.

MS. LICARRI: I hear you.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN. I mean, there's about 15 things here --

MS. LICARRI: Right.

COUNCIL ZUCKERMAN: --of what we're going to do. It is our hope that this makes things better and if it doesn't, we will go back to the drawing board, but we're hopeful that this'll help in conjunction with enforcements and I can tell you that both myself and the Supervisor will continue to communicate with the Nassau County Police Department as well as have our code enforcement folks there, but --because they need to go hand and hand.

MS. LICARRI: Right.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Enforcement and regulations need to go hand and hand. And I can tell you for this strip of property, we might have the most traffic restrictions in the town and that's what we're doing. So we're really trying and I can tell you that everyone, all of us, we've all spent a lot of strength and effort on this and we want to make it work.

MS. LICARRI: Yes. Yes. We certainly appreciate your time and effort, at least my husband and myself do.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: And I'll tell you the meeting that you're talking about, I thought it was a wonderful meeting, you know, Covid distancing aside, we all got to meet face to face and really talk about what, you know, what could be done and how we could help.

MS. LICARRI: Yeah. Now when should we expect these changes to be implemented? When should we expect the signs and the painting and all to happen?

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Do we have our -- is our highway --

SUPERVISOR BOSWORTH: Is Harry Weed?

MS. BRINN: I'll grab him.

MS. LICARRI: Because the sooner, the better. It is an ice cream, and if it happens in December.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: I can tell you, it doesn't happen overnight, but our highway commissioner will probably give a better sense. But it doesn't happen overnight. I can tell you that.

MS. LICARRI: Right. Right. Because I want to see how long are we going to have it implemented before, you know, we can tell if it's working or not. If we do it in three months, six months --

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: We're going to have to give it a decent amount of time.

MS. LICARRI: Right. Agreed.

MR. WINK: Councilman, if I could, I'll give you my understanding of it as the town clerk.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Yeah.

MR. WINK: Once this is adopted tonight, there is a notice in the adoption that has to be published in the local papers, just as it was a notice of public hearing before this item came on. That has to be filed as well as to my understanding. Every traffic ordinance in the town gets filed with the Secretary of State's office in Albany and I believe that is 20 days after that filing -- and

then I'll ask Harry to verify or debunk that, but it's approximately 20 days after the the filing in which the work order will then go out to initiate the work.

MS. LICARRI: Okay.

MR. WINK: Mr. Weed, that's my understanding of the legal procedure. Is that accurate to your knowledge?

MR. WEED: Correct. We can make the signs up and have them -- everything set and ready to go up and once we get the legal, go ahead, we can have it installed.

MR. WINK: Right.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: So we'll be communicating with Andy and we'll let you know the timeline as soon as we have it, but as you can see it is something that can take, you know, an excess of 20 days at this point.

MS. LICARRI: Okay. Well, thank you very much and I appreciate everybody's time and helping us out here.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Thank you.

MR. WINK: Nicholas Genise (phonetic).

MR. GENISE: Yes, hi. How is everybody today?

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Thank you for coming tonight, sir.

MR. GENISE: So the first quick point that was brought to my attention. You can't see it from so far away, but there is a car packed exactly in the spot that we're talking about today, right now while we're having the meeting. So it just shows the prevalence of how often and I appreciate everything --

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Sir, not to interrupt you.

MR. GENISE: Go ahead.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: But Mr. Machinski sent us, as well as the inspector from the police precinct, photos every day.

MR. GENISE: And that's great. It's a very good example.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: And you can hear all the things we're doing.

MR. GENISE: Yeah.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: So I mean showing us a photo, you know, of one car parked -

MR. GENISE: No. No, that's wonderful. So you were sorry to interrupt me and I'll be just as sorry to interrupt you when I say those are great things you're proposing, but from my experience, not in the public sector, but in a private sector, the first thing that drives everything is economics. Not how we're going to enforce, but why don't we cut to the chase and install a camera like they have in New York City? If you drive in the bus lane, they zap your license plate and you get a ticket sent to you.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: So we're not able to place a camera in that location.

MR. GENISE: So let's please -- let's find a way to enforce economically because what we find --

and I had this last year when we had a blizzard. I was driving home from the city to work and I make a turn in and somebody -- because when the town plows, it takes up two sides, so it becomes a one-way street and then someone was parked in front of the yogurt store. And I said, "you're in the way" and she yelled at me and said "It's an F'ing storm" and I said that's my point exactly. But that's where I leave it. We need to see action that's not just painting the lines and this -- because I've called the 60th Precinct before and I was told we can send someone out. By the time they come out and they're distracted from real crimes, they're not going to get there in time.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: You know, sir I take offense to what you're saying about the 6th Precinct and in fact, I want to read -- I'm going to read an email and I'm going to read you this email from Inspector Begis that he sent to Andy talking about this, so that he explained exactly what the 6th Precinct is going through and like I said, I'm taking offense to what you're saying about the 6th Precinct, so I'm going to read this. "Andy, members of the Nassau County Police Department" -- and this is not directed at Andy. This is a -- Andy is a liaison for the block, so that is why it was written to him, but let me read it, okay, sir? "Andy" -- this was from August 25th at 1:31 p.m. "Andy, members of the Nassau Country Police Department have been in that location many times and have actually sat in the location for hours. Pop officers, the enforcement car, the post car, our parking enforcement aid have all been there and when they're present, no violations have taken place because they are there. Police officers from this command have spoken with you, explaining what is going on. Every village within the 6th Precinct has some kind of parking conditions, as does my neighborhood on the south shore. We respond to them when possible, but calls for service supersede a parking condition. We don't need any more photos. We just had another meeting involving our pop officers and our enforcement PO. They will continue to give it attention, but as other issues arise, they will be redirected as needed.

MR. GENISE: So sometimes you think you don't need any photos, but it helps to reinforce what's going on. I take offense to the fact that it has to be read this way because what I'll say is the call that I made to talk about it to the precinct was because I called 311 and the Town and they said these things can -- call the precinct for it. I don't expect police officers to be called out for somebody who's parked there, but --

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: That's what it sounds like you're saying.

MR. GENISE: Well, maybe the minutes can be read back because we're having a conflict of translation here. What I'm saying is that I was redirected by the Town's 311 to call the 6th Precinct for this issue. When I did, they said they would send someone out. I said by the time someone comes out, no one will be parked there. So if you sat for hours and didn't see someone there, wow, what a, like, once in a blue moon moment because I'm showing you that someone's there right now. And it's going to get to the point where News 12 will report somebody was hit, someone was hurt etc. and I'm saying that all the measures you're discussing, they've been done in other places. It's something that -- there's a bit of class warfare in what we're discussing. You have people -- I mean, you can look at the cars parked there, from every car make that's been put through, they're expensive automobiles. I've parked there and to someone ask them to move and they said "F you, keep driving" and I'm like excuse me? So they are people who just feel entitled like it's too much work to walk across the street to buy your yogurt and that's the issue. And everytime someone brings this up, you take offense to it.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: There are parking and safety things that we are --

MR. GENISE: I just want for the record to be -- on the record that you, Mr. Zuckerman, take offense to a business conversation.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: What you're saying about the Nassau County Police Department? Yes.

MR. GENISE: What did I say about them?

COUNCILMAN FERRERA: Can I just interject?

MR. GENISE: Read it back, what I said.

MR. FERRARA: I think we're getting a little bit off topic. I think -- and I know meetings have taken place to rectify the situation, one with community people over there. 40, 50, 60 people have discussed issues that they've had and possibly other issues. The series of resolutions that are being proposed tonight are going to be implemented.

MR. GENISE: Okay. But --

COUNCIL FERRARA: Okay. And --(Cross conversation.)

MR. GENISE: And I'll leave it at that.

COUNCILMAN FERRERA: Okay. But that's your opinion and if this doesn't work, we can still go back to the drawing board. Just because that's your opinion does not mean that we have to change our policy and procedure. We take your advice, we listen to it, we see if these things work, we digest it and then we go back and readdress it.

That is why we are launching Let's Walk PW this month with the help and support of the town and why we wholeheartedly support the town bringing Pedalshare bike share to Port Washington. Pedalshare increases the opportunity for green transportation, health, wellness and socialization and economic development. We are thrilled to join the eight other vibrant towns and villages on Long Island and to add to the already 200 bikes and 50 stations across the island. MS. GERMAIN: Okay. Good. My name is Mindy Germain. I reside at 19 Beacon Drive. I'm program manager of Transit Solutions, a regional program funded by the EPA --a regional program funded by the EPA to reduce traffic and improve air quality in Long Island by

promoting sustainable mobility. I also sit on the USGBC Long Island Sustainable Transportation Committee and cochair of Car Free Day Long Island. Here are the facts. Almost 40 percent of Long Island greenhouse gases come from vehicles. Most car trips are less than two miles and parking and traffic are bottlenecking Long Island. I enthusiastically support this town resolution to bring Pedalshare bike share pilot to Port Washington and to the whole Town of North Hempstead. This is a step towards a better, more equitable, and resilient future. The Town of North Hempstead is the first town in Nassau County to take this inspiring step, a step that has proven in other communities to be a catalyst to creating a safe biking culture. A step closer to a cleaner, greener community and a step away from Long Island's gas guzzling car culture. Since Pedalshare has been introduced in the village of Babylon, popular programs such as bike parades, rodeos and helmet checks run by New York coalition for the transit --transportation safety has been implemented. Way finding signage has been added and a bike repair station is been planned. People that ride through the downtown are free to shop and dine without looking for that dreaded parking spot and screen time can be replaced with scenic rides and panoramic views. The Town of North Hempstead is exploring locations at the Long Island railroad station, town dock, Manorhaven Beach Park and North Hempstead Beach park. These locations will not only encourage recreational biking, but also bike transit connectivity. 
