SUPERVISOR DESENA: Okay. We ready? Okay. Hello everybody. Let's get started with a pledge. Can we all stand? Mr. Chiara, would you like to lead us?

(PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.)

SUPERVISOR DESENA: Okay. If we could remain standing, I'd like to ask for a moment of silence for our military and our first responders, and also for the family of a town employee who passed away last week.

(Moment of Silence.)

SUPERVISOR DESENA: Okay, thank you. Our employee lost his wife last year and unfortunately leaves behind three teenagers. So we could all keep Michael O'Connor and his family in our thoughts and prayers. Thank you. I would like to first make a --well, are we going to do public comment first? Okay. RESOLUTION NO. 627 - 2022

A PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER THE ADOPTION OF A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 75 OF THE TOWN CODE ENTITLED "WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATIONS FACILITIES".

WHEREAS, the Town Board, as the legislative body of the Town of North Hempstead, is empowered to amend the Town Code pursuant to the provisions of Article 9 of the New York State Constitution, the Town Law, and the Municipal Home Rule Law; and

WHEREAS, a proposed Local Law has been prepared, pursuant to enabling legislation, to amend the Town Code by the adoption of a Local Law amending Chapter 75 of the Town Code entitled "Wireless Telecommunications Facilities" in order create an administrative process for the issuance of permits by the Department of Building Safety, Inspection and Enforcement for the construction of temporary structures, including monopoles, to support the temporary relocation of existing wireless equipment while the primary site is being renovated; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Local Law, in final form, has been on the desks or tables of all the members of the Town Board for seven calendar days, exclusive of Sunday; and

WHEREAS, due notice has been heretofore given of a public hearing to be held on the 15th day of December, 2022, concerning the adoption of the proposed Local Law, which Local Law was available for viewing by the public on the Town's website and during regular business hours in the Office of the Town Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board carefully considered the proposed Local Law during the aforesaid seven-day period, conducted said hearing on December 15, 2022, with respect to said Local Law, and has afforded all interested persons an opportunity to be heard at the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to General Municipal Law § 239-m, the Nassau County Planning Commission (the "Commission") was furnished with a copy of the Short Environmental Assessment Form (the "SEAF") and proposed local law; and

WHEREAS, the Commission, by letter dated December 9, 2022, has deferred to the Town to take action as deemed appropriate; and

WHEREAS, it is required that a "lead agency" be established to review the action pursuant to the rules and regulations for the implementation of the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act as set forth in Title 6, Part 617.6(b) of the

Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York (“SEQRA Regulations”); and

WHEREAS, this Board, through action of the Town Department of Planning and Environmental Protection (the “Planning Department”) pursuant to Town Code §20-4, has established itself as lead agency and wishes to render a determination of significance pursuant to the SEQRA regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed the determination of the Planning Department, dated December 9, 2022, and the Negative Declaration indicating that the action constitutes an “Unlisted Action” pursuant to Section 617.2(al) of the SEQRA Regulations which will not result in any significant adverse impacts on the environment based upon the analysis set forth in the Short Environmental Assessment Form (the “SEAF”) Parts 1, 2, and 3 (the “Determinations and Negative Declaration”) for the reasons stated in the SEAF; and

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to conclude that the action constitutes an “Unlisted Action” pursuant to Section 617.2(al) of the SEQRA Regulations and that it will not result in any significant adverse impacts on the environment; and

WHEREAS, this Board deems it in the public interest to adopt said proposed Local Law, to be effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State of the State of New York (the “Secretary of State”).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED that the Town Board declares itself “lead agency” under the SEQRA Regulations for the Action; and be it further

RESOLVED that this Board hereby adopts the Planning Department’s Determinations and Negative Declaration, finding that the Action is an “Unlisted Action” which will not result in any significant adverse impact on the environment, based upon the analysis set forth in the SEAF; and be it further

RESOLVED that this Board hereby authorizes the Planning Department to prepare, file and distribute such documents as may be required pursuant to Section 617.2 of the SEQRA Regulations to effectuate the foregoing determinations and findings made pursuant to the SEQRA Regulations; and be it further

RESOLVED that Local Law No. 22 of 2022 be and it hereby is adopted, which Local Law reads as follows:

**TOWN OF NORTH HEMPSTEAD
LOCAL LAW NO. 22 OF 2022**

**A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 75 OF THE TOWN CODE
ENTITLED “WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATIONS FACILITIES”**

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of North Hempstead, as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Intent.

The Board finds that it is in the best interest of the Town of North Hempstead to amend Chapter 75 of the Town Code to create an administrative process for the issuance of temporary antenna location permits by the Building Department for temporary support structures and the temporary relocation of existing wireless telecommunications equipment to those structures to facilitate the repair and/or renovation of the existing permanent tower or base station.

Section 2.

Section 75-2 of the Town Code is hereby amended as follows:

§ 75-2 Definitions.

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

ABANDONED

Any wireless telecommunications facility which has not been operational for six consecutive months.

ACCESSORY STRUCTURE

A structure such as a storage shed or other type of enclosure for equipment, equipment cabinets, support structures for equipment or other appurtenances used in conjunction with the operation of a wireless telecommunications facility as defined herein and located on the same lot as, or in the general vicinity of, the wireless telecommunications facility.

ANTENNA

A system of electrical conductors that transmits or receives radio frequency signals. Such signals shall include, but not be limited to, those associated with cellular telephone, personal communication services and microwave communications. For the purpose of this chapter an antenna shall include any panels, boxes, dishes or other type of enclosures which contain the actual transmitting or receiving devices.

ANTENNA LOCATION PERMIT

A type of building permit issued by the Building Department in accordance with the requirements set forth in § 70-5 for the placement of wireless telecommunications facilities.

APPLICANT

A person, firm, organization or company applying for either an antenna location permit or a special permit under the provisions of this section. An applicant must qualify as a wireless carrier/service provider as defined herein.

BASE STATION

A. A structure or equipment at a fixed location that enables FCC-licensed or authorized wireless telecommunications between user equipment and a communications network. The term does not encompass a tower as defined herein or any equipment associated with a tower. "Base station" includes, without limitation:

(1) Equipment associated with wireless communications services such as private, broadcast, and public safety services, as well as unlicensed wireless services and fixed wireless services such as microwave backhaul.

(2) Radio transceivers, antennas, coaxial or fiber-optic cable, regular and backup power supplies, and comparable equipment, regardless of technological configuration (including distributed antenna systems and small cell networks).

(3) Any structure other than a tower that, at the time the relevant application is filed with the Town under this section, supports or houses equipment defined as a "wireless telecommunications facility" that has been reviewed and approved under the applicable zoning or siting process, or under another state or local regulatory review process.

B. The term does not include any structure that, at the time the relevant application is filed with the Town under this chapter, does not support or house equipment defined as a "wireless telecommunications facility."

BUILDING COMMISSIONER

The Commissioner of the Building Department.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

The Town of North Hempstead Department of Building Safety, Inspection and Enforcement.

CAMOUFLAGE

A method of disguising a wireless telecommunications facility which makes it appear as part of the surroundings, either natural or man-made.

CELL ON WHEELS

A wireless telecommunications facility which is usually affixed to a truck, trailer or other mobile base and is located temporarily at a particular site.

CO-LOCATION

The mounting or installation of wireless telecommunications facilities on an eligible support structure for the purpose of transmitting and/or receiving radio frequency signals for communications purposes.

DISTRIBUTED ANTENNA SYSTEMS or DAS

A network of partially separated antenna nodes connected to a tower, right-of-way structure or public utility structure via a fiber system or other transport medium that

provides wireless telecommunications services within a limited geographic area or structure.

ELIGIBLE FACILITY REQUEST

A. Any request for modification of an existing tower or existing base station or an existing right-of-way structure that is not a substantial change to the physical dimensions of such tower, base station or structure and involves:

- (1) The co-location of new transmission equipment; or
- (2) The removal of transmission equipment; or
- (3) The replacement of transmission equipment.

B. A request for the modification of an existing right-of-way structure shall not be an eligible facility request unless the applicant has obtained a right-of-way use agreement from the Town in compliance with this chapter.

ELIGIBLE SUPPORT STRUCTURE

Any tower or base station as defined in this section, provided that it is existing at the time the relevant application is filed with Building Department under this chapter.

EQUIPMENT

Computers, batteries, generators, transmission equipment and cabinets, etc., which are utilized to power and/or operate a wireless telecommunications facility.

HEIGHT

The distance measured vertically from the average level of the curb of the lowest adjoining street or from the lowest point within a radius of 200 feet measured radially from the facility, whichever is lower, to the highest point on the building, structure, or freestanding wireless telecommunications facility as prescribed in Chapter 70 of the Code.

INCUMBENT WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATIONS FACILITY

Any wireless telecommunications facility legally constructed, erected and operated as of the date of adoption of this chapter, or one erected under a special permit issued by the Town in accordance with this chapter and for which any applicable permits have been acquired from all appropriate government authorities.

NONCOMPLIANT STRUCTURE or NONCOMPLIANT USE

A structure or use that does not conform to the regulations of the district in which it is situated.

PLANNING COMMISSIONER

The Commissioner of the Planning Department.

PLANNING DEPARTMENT

The Town of North Hempstead Department of Planning and Environmental Protection.

PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY

Any right-of-way owned or maintained by the Town of North Hempstead.

PUBLIC UTILITY

Any company authorized (either by the New York State public Service Commission, a municipality or other such authority) to provide water, electric, gas or telephone services to the public.

PUBLIC UTILITY STRUCTURE

Any structure erected for the purposes of providing a public utility service, including, but not limited to, water towers, electric transmission towers/poles and telephone poles, but not including a right-of-way structure.

RIGHT-OF-WAY STRUCTURE

Any pole or other structure within the public right-of-way.

SMALL CELL FACILITY

A wireless telecommunications facility that meets each of the following conditions;

A. The structure on which wireless telecommunications facility is mounted:

(1) Is 50 feet or less in height; or

(2) Is no more than 10% taller than other adjacent structures; or

(3) Is not extended to a height of more than 10% above its preexisting height as a result of the co-location of new antenna facilities; and

B. Each antenna (excluding associated antenna equipment) is no more than three cubic feet in volume; and

C. All antenna equipment associated with the facility (excluding antennas) are cumulatively no more than 28 cubic feet in volume; and

D. The facility does not require antenna structure registration under applicable federal regulations; and

E. The facility does not result in human exposure to radiofrequency radiation in excess of the applicable safety standards specified in 47 CFR 1.1307(b).

SMALL CELL NETWORK

One or more small cell facilities connected by a fiber to a carrier switching system or

other means of interconnection for provision of wireless services within a limited geographic area or structure.

SPECIAL PERMIT

A permit for a use which is deemed allowable within a given zoning district, but which is potentially incompatible with other uses and is subject to special standards and conditions set forth by the Town Board, consistent with § 274-b of the Town Law.

STEALTH TECHNOLOGY/STEALTH STRUCTURE

A method of installing/constructing wireless telecommunications facilities which conceals, hides or camouflages their presence. Some examples of stealth structures are man-made antenna supports which resemble trees, flagpoles and light poles.

SUBSTANTIAL CHANGE

A modification to the physical dimensions of an eligible support structure if it meets any of the following criteria:

- A. The mounting of the proposed antenna on existing towers that increases the existing height of the tower by more than 10%, or the mounting of an additional antenna array with separation from the nearest existing antenna exceeding 20 feet, whichever is greater;
- B. The mounting of a proposed antenna would involve the installation of more than the standard number of new equipment cabinets for the technology involved, not to exceed four, or more than one new equipment shelter;
- C. The mounting of the proposed antenna would involve adding an appurtenance to the body of existing towers, other than towers in the public rights-of-way that would protrude from the edge of the towers more than 20 feet, or more than the width of the tower structure at the level of the appurtenance, whichever is greater;
- D. The modification would involve excavation outside the current existing tower or base station site, defined as the current boundaries of the leased or owned property surrounding the existing tower or base station and any access or utility easements currently related to the site;
- E. The modification defeats concealment elements of the support structure; or
- F. The modification does not comply with prior conditions of the approval for the existing tower or base station; provided, however, that this limitation does not apply to any modification that is noncompliant only in a manner that would not exceed the thresholds in Subsections A through D above.

TEMPORARY SUPPORT STRUCTURE

Any tower or base station as defined in this section, which does not exist, or is intended not to exist, for more than 180 days and is located within the

current boundaries of the leased or owned property surrounding an existing permanent tower or base station.

TOWER

Any structure built for the sole or primary purpose of supporting any FCC-licensed or authorized antenna(s) and their associated facilities, including structures that are constructed for wireless communications services, including, but not limited to, private, broadcast, and public safety services, as well as unlicensed wireless services and fixed wireless services such as microwave backhaul, and the associated site. Street light poles, public utility and traffic light poles without an attached approved wireless telecommunications facility or right-of-way structures shall not be considered a tower.

WIRELESS CARRIER/SERVICE PROVIDER

Any company which is licensed by the FCC to operate wireless telecommunications facilities.

WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATIONS FACILITY

Antenna(s) and associated equipment used to transmit and/or receive audio, video, data and other information using radio frequency energy and other electronic or electromagnetic systems. The antenna(s) and equipment of each wireless carrier, including small cell and DAS networks, shall be separately considered a wireless telecommunications facility.

Section 3.

Section 75-5 of the Town Code is hereby amended as follows:

§ 75-5 Antenna location permits.

A. Wireless telecommunications facility installations eligible for antenna location permits. The Building Department is authorized to issue antenna location permits for the following wireless telecommunications facilities, provided that all of the requirements set forth herein are met.

(1) Nonresidential zoning districts. Parking District (P), Transportation District (T), Business AA District (B-AA), Business A District (B-A), Business B District (B-B), Planned Industrial Park District (PIP), Industrial A District (I-A), Industrial B (I-B), Modified Planned Industrial Park District (MPIP):

(a) Small cell facilities, small cell networks and DAS networks upon an existing or new right-of-way structure within the public right-of-way, provided that a special permit is granted by the Town Board and right-of-way use agreement is executed by the Town and applicant.

(b) An eligible facilities request, where such application does not result in a substantial change to the eligible support structure. If a substantial change is proposed, the application shall require a special permit pursuant to § 75-6 of this chapter.

(c) New wireless telecommunications facilities on existing commercial or industrial buildings, provided that all applicable height, setback and design requirements as set forth in § 75-7 herein can be met. Any accessory structures, including, but not limited to, equipment, equipment cabinets, equipment sheds/shelters, etc., must also comply with the applicable standards set forth in § 75-7 herein.

(d) Minor modifications to existing wireless telecommunications facilities, that do not result in substantial change as defined herein, if a substantial change is proposed, the application shall require a special permit pursuant to § 75-6 of this chapter.

(e) Temporary support structures constructed for the temporary relocation of existing equipment to facilitate the repair and/or renovation of the existing permanent tower or base station. In addition to a permit for the temporary support structure a separate antenna location permit shall be required for each wireless carrier/service provider relocating their equipment to the temporary support structure. The standards set forth in § 75-7 herein shall not apply to temporary support structures under this section or any equipment relocated to a temporary support structure.

(2) Residential Zoning Districts. Residence Open Space District (R-O-S), Residence AAA District (R-AAA), Residence AA District (R-AA), Residence A District (R-A), Residence B District (R-B), Residence C District (R-C), Residence D District (R-D), Residence District Multiple (RM), Residence District, public Housing (RPH), Golden Age Residence District (GAR), Senior Residence District (R-S):

(a) Small cell facilities, small cell networks and DAS networks upon an existing or new right-of-way structure within the public right-of-way, provided that a special permit is granted by the Town Board and right-of-way use agreement is executed by the Town and applicant.

(b) An eligible facilities request of wireless telecommunications facilities, where such application does not result in a substantial change. If a substantial change is proposed, the application shall require a special permit pursuant to § 75-6 of this chapter.

(c) Temporary support structures constructed for the temporary relocation of existing equipment to facilitate the repair and/or renovation of the existing permanent tower or base station. In addition to a permit for the temporary support structure a separate antenna location permit shall be required for each wireless carrier/service provider relocating their equipment to the temporary support structure. The standards set forth in § 75-7 herein shall not apply to temporary support structures under this section or any equipment relocated to a temporary support structure.

B. Term and fees for antenna location permits. The fee for an antenna location permit shall be in the amount indicated in the Town of North Hempstead Fee Schedule, and the permit expires and must be renewed every three years, **except in the case of an antenna location permit for a temporary support structure constructed for the temporary relocation of existing equipment, which fee shall be listed in the Town of North Hempstead Fee Schedule for temporary structures**

and which permit shall expire after 180 days and may be renewed for up to a maximum of three 180 day extensions.

C. Renewal of antenna location permits. At the expiration of its [~~three-year~~] term, **as set forth in subsection (B) above**, an application for renewal of the antenna location permit shall be filed with the Building Commissioner together with the fee stated in the Town of North Hempstead Fee Schedule and current certification by a licensed professional engineer or other qualified person that the wireless telecommunications facility is within the nonionizing electromagnetic radiation levels adopted by the FCC. The permit may be renewed upon a finding that the wireless facility and all associated equipment and support structures are structurally sound and comply with the provisions of the law.

D. Antenna location permit application requirements. The Building Commissioner is authorized to design appropriate application forms, if necessary, to assist in the completion and evaluation of an application packet. The following materials shall be submitted in triplicate to the Building Commissioner, who shall certify that an application packet is complete before an antenna location permit is issued:

- (1) Completed antenna location permit application form.
- (2) Name, address and telephone number of the applicant.
- (3) Name, address and telephone number of the owner of the property on which the wireless telecommunications facility will be located.
- (4) Section, block and lot number(s) of the property on which the proposed facility will be located.
- (5) A copy of an agreement between the applicant and the owner of the site which authorizes the use of the site as a location for the proposed wireless telecommunications facility, or, if the wireless telecommunications facility is to be located within a public right-of-way or the right-of-way of another municipality, an executed franchise agreement with the municipality owning or controlling the right-of-way.
- (6) A location map to scale indicating the location of the proposed facility.
- (7) A site plan or plans to scale specifying the location of the proposed facility on the property. All setbacks of the facility from front, rear and side yards shall be shown. (If the facility is located upon an existing structure, the setbacks of the existing structure from front, rear and side yards shall be shown and the location of the facility on the existing structure, including all dimensions, shall be shown).

(8) Elevations showing the height of all proposed antennas, equipment and supporting structures (i.e., monopoles, towers, etc.) from ground level. Dimensions of all antennas and equipment and the distances of each from the top of any structures upon which they are located shall also be shown.

(9) Construction/engineering drawings to be reviewed by the Building Commissioner to determine whether the proposed facility meets with all applicable building, fire and safety codes and showing that the facility includes appropriate deicing equipment.

(10) A completed full environmental assessment form Part 1, together with a visual assessment addendum.

(11) A cash deposit or bond from a surety company that is both an admitted carrier in the State of New York and has a Best's Rating of B- or better, or a Best's rating of four or better.

(a) The cash deposit or bond must be in an amount equal to 200% of the estimated cost of removing any wireless telecommunications facility, if it is abandoned, and of restoring the site, except that this requirement may be waived for a cells on wheels.

(b) In the event that a penalty is assessed pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, the Building Commissioner or the Town Comptroller may deduct the amount of such penalty from the cash deposit.

(c) The applicant must maintain the required cash deposit or bond at all times.

(12) A certificate of insurance naming the Town of North Hempstead as an additional insured.

(13) A copy of any Federal Communications Commission licenses and approvals allowing the applicant to operate a wireless telecommunications facility.

(14) Certification by a licensed professional engineer or other qualified person that the proposed facility will not cause interference with existing communication devices and that electromagnetic radiation levels at the proposed site are within any threshold levels that have been adopted by the Federal Communications Commission.

E. Review of applications for antenna location permits. Upon receipt of a complete application for an antenna location permit, the Building Commissioner or his or her designee shall review such application to determine whether the application so qualifies for an antenna location permit as defined in this chapter. If determined to be eligible for an antenna location permit, such application shall be approved or denied within the following time frames, unless such time periods are lawfully extended:

(1) Installation of a small cell facility on an existing right-of-way structure: 60 days.

(2) Installation of any other wireless telecommunications facility on an existing support structure: 90 days.

(3) Installation of a small cell facility on a new right-of-way structure: 90 days, unless it has been determined that the application creates a substantial change or otherwise does not meet the criteria of an eligible facilities request, in which case other applicable provisions of this chapter apply, and further provided that the above time periods may be tolled if the Building Commissioner or his or her designee finds that the application is incomplete or if the Building Commissioner or his or her designee finds that additional information is needed to evaluate the application within 10 days of its submission. Once an eligible facilities request application has been approved, the Building Inspector shall issue the antenna location permit and a building permit.

Section 4.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

A PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER APPROVAL OF TAX EXEMPT FINANCING FOR THE LEASE/PURCHASE OF A NEW FIRE TRUCK BY THE ALBERTSON HOOK & LADDER, ENGINE & HOSE COMPANY NO. 1, INC.

WHEREAS, the Albertson Hook & Ladder, Engine & Hose Co., No. 1, Inc., Albertson, New York (the "Fire Company") provides firefighting services within specific areas of the Town of North Hempstead; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Company has entered into a lease/purchase agreement for one (1) new 2022 Pierce Enforcer 1500 gallons pumper that provides for \$320,000.00 in financing provided by PNC Equipment Finance, 155 E. Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215 at a total lease/purchase cost not to exceed \$705,269.13 over 3 years; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Company wishes to obtain tax-exempt financing pursuant to the provisions of Sections 147(f) and 150 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"); and

WHEREAS, such provisions of the Code require that a public hearing be held by the Town Board to give all interested persons an opportunity to be heard concerning the proposed purchase transaction by the Fire Company; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 587-2022 duly adopted at its meeting held on November 17, 2022, the Town Board set December 15, 2022 as the date to hold a public hearing to consider the approval of tax-exempt financing for the lease/purchase of the aforesaid fire truck; and

WHEREAS, the lease shall be the sole obligation of the Fire Company, and nothing in the lease, nor in this Resolution, shall bind the Town directly or as a principal or guarantor; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing has been duly held by this Board to consider approval of said lease/purchase and all interested persons were afforded an opportunity to be heard concerning same; and

WHEREAS, said lease/purchase requires approval by the municipal subdivision in order to qualify for tax-exempt financing; and

WHEREAS, this Board finds that by using tax-exempt financing the Fire Company can save substantial sums of money in interest payments; and

WHEREAS, this Board finds it to be in the best interests of public health and safety that the aforesaid fire truck be leased and acquired by the Fire Company.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT

COUNCILMAN ADHAMI: In some --

SUPERVISOR DESENA: -- transfer is and --

COUNCILMAN ADHAMI: Well, in sum and substance, Harbor Hill Civic Association found out about this today, they're not sure where the funding is being spent. Although I do have the supporting documentation and it is for their own parks and other expenses for Harbor Hills. The Civic Association, I guess, wants to see the supporting documentation and a better explanation of how this money is being spent.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: Is there any consequence to holding off on this vote until next meeting?

MR. CHIARA: Well, there's a series of other supplemental appropriations that taxes, I think this may be --

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Is it possible to -- can I just ask this, is it possible to separate this?

MR. CHIARA: I guess you could move to remove it. We'd have to look at the resolution.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Can we finish the voting first and then --

MR. CHIARA: Yeah, I think you should finish the voting if you want to reconsider it.

COUNCIL WOMAN LURVEY: Right. That makes -- that seems to make sense. And --

COUNCIL WOMAN DALIMONTE: I'm sorry. There'll be three items. Sorry. I'm sorry. There'll be three items still there.

COUNCIL WOMAN LURVEY: Town attorney. Can we do that?

MR. CHIARA: Yes. I just need --

COUNCIL WOMAN LURVEY: The only thing is that there's certain -- there's like certain ones here, that we want to vote on. So, we want to split part of it.

(cross-talk).

COUNCIL WOMAN DALIMONTE: So, could we ask -- could Rachel bring in a copy of the resolution from Novus agenda?

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Can she? It's right here.

MR. CHIARA: I don't know what the intention of the board would want on that to remove these items.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: I think there's the intent to remove all the Harbor Hill items. So maybe a way to do that would be to rescind our previous vote.

MR. CHIARA: Right.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: And then vote to amend the resolution to exclude the Harbor Hills items.

MR. CHIARA: I just don't know the -- I just don't know the -- like I'm not sure who added that and why was added. Can I even speak to why it was added?

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: To what was added? The Harbor Hills?

MR. CHIARA: Yeah. I mean I don't know if they're going to be able to balance the budget.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: It's taking it out of --

MR. CHIARA: I'm not in control.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: But I believe, I believe all the Harbor Hill entries are internal within the Harbor Hills budget, so it doesn't impact any other part of the town. So, it's just internal stuff that we could come and fix later

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Over budget, sir.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Oh, we're trying to cover -- so they're going over -- they're going to be over budget for the 2022 budget

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: I think they are. Then, yes.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: So, we don't vote on it now. They will enter the new year, which isn't the end of the world.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: To John. Thank you.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: In your words.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Well no, but is there a legal requirement that everything being in balance?

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: That's a good question.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: So I'm just going to -- can I get a discussion? It sounds to me like this is about accounting. Is that right?

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: I can tell you that's what it is.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Yeah. This is about accounting. So, I'm not really sure what the objection is. It's not really a function of how the money gets spent for next year. They're just trying to tidy up the books, which by law they may have to do but you can't have a negative amount.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: Scalero, can you - -

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Yes. I think Councilman Troiano summed up all of this, there's a terrible sound on this tonight.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Mm-hmm (affirmative)

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: This is a year-end. They traditionally go over budget within that fund in certain areas, and we've always had to transfer money over from one line to another to cover that. So, it's not appropriate any addition of monies to them and they're not

losing any monies on there. If anything, you can make an argument that perhaps I should be careful not to go over those budget lines in the future, but it -- it is a routine year-end item from what I'm told. And it's not out of line from prior years.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Right --

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: In terms of total amount.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: I think what their concern is because of all the times that they've been here, I think what their concern is, they're very particular. Remember when they've been here, they're very particular about their fund balance. And I believe it's taking \$55,000 out of their fund balance. And they want the backup. I guess they, you know, they --

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: But again, this goes back to something we said during the budget sessions. It's a park district. It's not some separate their money, it's the town's money, it's the town's park district. And the monies that are in that district, at Councilman Troiano's point, are exclusive to that district. I mean it's the nature of a park district. So if they come up short, they have to move it from their fund balance, not from the general fund or not from the parks funds. So, the problem is that they --they go over budget in an area, it's got to come out of their district budget regardless of the amount. Whether it's 55,000 or 5,500. But there seems to be some sort of mistaken sense of ownership of that money that it's, it's somehow some separate pot of money apart from the park district and it's not.

COUNCILMAN ADHAMI: And the -- and deputy supervisor, part of the issue of the Civic association has brought to my attention is that they believe the amounts are excessive for some reason I haven't gotten any other reasoning, but they believe that the amounts are overtime and certain seasonal workers is more than they have earned.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Okay. My understanding though is that this is not covering any of those items. This covers purchases that were made during the year. At least in some cases. Yeah. They bought new furniture.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: There is some though for overtime, for health insurance, for social security.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Yeah. They do have park personnel, town personnel assigned permanently there. And when that person is not there, they do incur overtime. Much of this is at the district's request. But again, it's all part and parcel to the park district. It's all -- those are all things contained within that district, so.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: So for any board member that wants the in-novice agenda, there is a listing of the \$55,000 how it is broken out.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Mm-hmm (affirmative).

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: And it mainly is, you know, it's a -- I don't know if I want to say -- you want to say it's your district here.

COUNCILMAN WALSH: Yeah.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: And the point is if they say that these seem excessive, it's -- then don't go over the budget map. I don't mean to simplify but --

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: It is what it is, right? You know, they spent that over time, they

may feel like it's too much shouldn't have been spent, but it's been spent and so now there's a deficit in that account and it needs to be brought to zero and you have to take that either from another account with excess.

COUNCILMAN ADHAMI: Right.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Or take it from the fund balance. This is just accounting. This is not a function of, you know, saying we want more overtime or less overtime. That's through management next year.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: So, all of these are to fund budget shortfalls of one form or another, but one supplemental budget appropriation is for the removal of a floating dock. So that's a little bit outside of the scope of a budget shortfall.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: That's right.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Well

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Can you repeat that?

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Not so much a shortfall as an overage --

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: \$5,500 is being moved from the unallocated fund balance of the Harbor Hill Special Park District to fund the removal of the floating dock.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Mm-hmm (affirmative).

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: So that's not a budget shortfall.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Is that what it says in Novice agenda?

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: It just says Harbor health dock removal.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: No, but I would -- I would characterize as an overage, not much a shortfall. If they were budgeted out, say 40,000 this year for that and they somehow spent 55, that -- that would be a \$15,000 overage. And that's what this total, this amount in total covers overages on each line that -- each item that happened. I don't know offhand the floating dock amount and where that came from. I know that they call somebody in every year to install it at the beginning of the season and take out at the end. That's usually a budgeted amount. I don't know why it would fluctuate that much within a year, but that specific line, I'd have to get back to you. But to Councilman Troiano's point, this is the third time tonight I've agreed with him, which they may begin throwing stuff at me, but not him. But you know, he once said, and I thought very, very adequately when it comes to budgets, budgets are a fluid document. And this is that year end as we approach January. Yes. I gave him the credit to that. So, I seem smart. But they are, they are a fluid document. As we approach the beginning of the new budget year, we have to start closing out these lines, and covering the money is there, it just needs to be shifted around from line to line for the accounting purposes and to make sure that we, when we come up on audit next year, that the auditors find that all the money is where it belongs. So, I mean I can get back to you with an answer on that specific floating dock item because I don't know.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: I don't really, you know, it's not a question about an answer. The question is what to do about it right now. You know, it's a difference in kind from covering a budget shortfall, because Mr. -- Councilman Troiano was saying it is what it is, right? A

budget shortfall is a budget shortfall. That number sort of is what it is. But if this is paying for the removal of a floating dock, then perhaps there could be some disagreement on that dollar amount.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: I think that that comment is miswritten. And that's why I asked what Novice Agenda says.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: If I may, I mean the easiest suggestion I would make, you've already voted on it, rather than go through the rescinding of votes and revoting or whatever the mechanisms. I've never heard of rescinding votes before. But I would ask you to let it go until the January meeting. We'll get you an answer before then. And if we need to then we can always amend that.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: You know, he's got three times where he agreed with me. I'm going to have one time where I agree with him.

COUNCILMAN WALSH: Well, I hate to say it, but I wasn't going to change my vote.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Yeah, I think, you know, I would agree with that. I think trying to amend it on the floor may result in us creating more confusion and we'll wind up amending the amendment. And I don't think there's really much point to that. And I would agree with Mr. --I've said it twice, but there's only one item though.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: It's only the same. You're just repeating.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: These meetings are being recorded, so.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: I agree. And this strikes me -- this is kind of items, that can be fixed if we need to.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Mm-hmm (affirmative)

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Come January once we have a time that, so we look at it.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: All right. We have so -- we have three men who rarely agree, agreeing in tonight. It's like the Trinity. I just want, you know since --

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: It's a holiday miracle.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: Since I voted yes though, I just want there to be an understanding that there will be, you know, this will be looked into. I don't like voting yes, if the Civic association, especially one that is as involved as the Harbor Hill Civic Association hasn't gotten the answers, all right, it has been asking for it, which is I think why Councilman Adhami rightfully called for a discussion about this. So, I'm okay going forward without changing my vote, not complicating things, but for the record, I would, you know, we -- we need to get the civic association the information.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: I will get you an answer as soon as we can put it together.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: But if I can just add to Councilmember Lurvey's expression by saying also that I, you know, she read that part one of the accounting entries is to provide for the removal of the floating dock. I think that's miswritten.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Mm-hmm (affirmative)

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: I would just ask that we not execute the actual removal until the board or whatever it is that manages the Harbor Hills District agrees that.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Thank you.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: Thank you.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: You want to say something, Michael?

SUPERVISOR DESENA: Mr. McDonald, do you want to -- did you want to

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: No, we vote. I'm sorry. We're in the middle of the vote so we can't have any more comments on the matter.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: I offer the resolution and move for its adoption.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilman Troiano?

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Aye.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilman Zuckerman?

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Aye.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilman Walsh?

COUNCILMAN WALSH: Aye.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilwoman Lurvey?

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: So, I have a bit of a concern about the revenues, that how is this going to affect the revenues of the agreement that we've just budgeted? Is there somebody here who can speak to that? Because this is a major change to the terms of the agreement going from multiple outings a week to one outing a week.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Is Paul with us?

SUPERVISOR DESENA: No, he's not here. This is an extension of our current contract. We will have a whole year to negotiate the next contract. So, we will be able to take the budget implications into account. We did hear tremendous feedback from the community that a public golf course is being paid for, you know, with taxpayer money should not be having private outings multiple times a week. So, we are going to bring this back to one outing per week. And this is something that will be in close contact with the operator about.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: So –

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: So –

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: No, go ahead.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: -- So, yeah, so it's true a municipal golf course right, should be open to the residents and not be taken up by outings so that residents have a hard time getting tee times. And I fully -- fully agree with that. But I'm wondering how did we arrive at the one-day-a-week rubric because we did in the budget increase revenue from Harbor Links by \$500,000 based on the existing contract, the terms of the existing contract, is my understanding. And so how is our budget next year in 2023 going to be impacted by this change?

SUPERVISOR DESENA: Well, I think as we've said, a budget is a fluid document and we are going to try and respond to the constituents who have said this public course should be open to the public. So as we negotiate the next contract throughout the next year, we'll be looking at -- at the costs and the, and the revenues.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: So has anyone had conversations with Harbor Links that if we go to once a week, which I agree, there have been many residents that have come and they want to have it open to them because we did increase their projected income by a half a million dollars. I worry about if they don't make the revenue, are they going to have to cut staff? Are

they going to -- the maintenance? So, has anyone discussed this with Century Golf about if we go to once a week, what would that do to their projected revenue?

SUPERVISOR DESENA: Century Golf agreed to this extension and to limit the outing --

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: They do?

SUPERVISOR DESENA: --to one day a week.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: -- they did?

SUPERVISOR DESENA: Yes.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Okay. And they said the projected revenue income would be fine?

SUPERVISOR DESENA: I'm not sure that they exactly did what they said, but they did, they did agree to limiting to one day a week.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: So that's why - -

(cross-talk)

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: That's to answer our question, what's the impact on our budget?

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Yes, because we increased -- we increased Harbor links from the 2022 budget to the 2023 budget. The projected revenue was increased by half a million dollars. So that has me a little bit worried because we increased it. So now we're going down because I do know when they have outings that there's more food, they get a lot of money for it, but, you know, it is a golf course that should be for the residents, but it scares me that we increased it by a half a million dollars, instead, I would've liked to have taken that projected revenue by new, and that's why on October 21st, I sent the supervisor and the town board a letter saying that, "guys, we have to be careful here because we don't know our agreement yet with Century Golf and we are projecting revenue." And we're -- that scares me that we increased it by half a million dollars and now they're going to be having outings of only one day. I think what we should have done and we all approved the budget already, we should have lessened the projected revenue. Because we were going down to one because a bulk of Harbor links, and we heard this actually from the residents, a bulk of their -- and you could go -- you could look at their projected, a bulk of their stuff comes from the outings. They're wondering --

SUPERVISOR DESENA: Excuse me. Let me just call up the deputy supervisor because he was involved in the budget and also with conversations with the concessionaire.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Thank you. I can, I think, I can address that.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Okay.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: There's a couple of factors though that we have to take into account. You remember when I addressed you, you brought this up during the budget --

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Yes.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: talks as well --

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: And I --

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: No, I understand. I'm just giving background for

anybody listening who may not be familiar with that. First, we have to look at the context. When you say the revenue went up by half million, as of the 31st, if you don't approve the extension, the revenue would be zero for the year because the contract would be out and the town would have to shut down the course. Well, there would be zero revenue. So that's the first thing. This keeps at least last year's numbers in place. The --

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: No, no, this doesn't keep last year's -- I'm sorry. This doesn't keep last year's numbers in place. This keeps the contract in place with --

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Okay.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: -- the only one --

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: If I may continue. It keeps this last year's numbers in place in terms of the price per round and in price, none of that will change. The outings are still costing the same. The difference is the number of outings that they'll be allowed to do, yes. You also have no way of knowing how many rounds are going to be played in a given year. That's always an open-end. You go by the best industry expectations. In terms of the outings, just by way of background they usually do not factor into the town's share of revenue to the fullest extent. What has happened in past years, and I was reluctant to bring this up in October, but it's -it's become a significant factor by asking them to limit it. It was at the town's urging that they would request, I'm told I wasn't involved before this year, obviously, that they were told to increase the number of outings and maximize them in any case because every outing they do was added revenue to the town. So, we're not really losing out on our revenue. Our revenue projection during budget was a very conservative number. It had more to do with what we think the number of rounds will be based on what they've told us and you got to remember also during COVID, there was a huge fluctuation for a number of years that was still coming out of. So that half million was a reasonable expectation based on the number of rounds played and an average of one outing a week. Now as you know, there were several weeks this summer where they were running five and six outings in a week. So, this really puts it back to your, to your point, Councilwoman Lurvey. It puts it back to the numbers that perhaps I should rephrase it, should have been seen last year in terms of outings, if you average one a week which is reasonable and it's an industry standard because almost every golf course including public golf courses, or municipal courses, Munis as they're referred to, runs outings because it subsidizes the cost to residents playing the rest of the week. So again, most of them limited though to one or two days. We have got an agreement, we reached out to Century Golf and said we don't want the golf course to close on December 31st. There's obviously not enough time to negotiate. It takes about a year because you have an ongoing season coming up, would you be interested in doing a one-year extension? They said absolutely, as long as they have the right to bid on whatever future RFP or bids, which is open to everybody anyway, so he said sure. Doesn't guarantee them an inside track but that just means that they will be allowed to bid like any -- there's probably five major operators in the country. They're one of them. So if they want to bid next they can, but if they're going to have to be competitive and to the point that I brought up to you during budget, if you want to put into those bid specifications limits on outings, then any of their future revenue projections or revenue sharing or cost, they're going to build that into their bid notes. And they'll say, you know, you may have one that says, I can only bid X amount because you're limiting my options on outings. And we'll know. Okay. Then you're out. You know, I mean it's -- you have to go with somebody who wants to accommodate the board.

So, but anyway, I'm going off on a tangent a bit, but they did say that they were interested in the one-year extension. I said, "you would have to honor the limit of one day a week maximum for outings for that year," and they said, "not a problem." And because we had already limited that in our budget estimates, it falls into that half a million dollars.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: So, thank you. That's basically the --

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: So it's a very long detailed way of saying we've already accounted for that.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: I was going to vote yes because I don't want it to close on December 31st, but I just wanted to make sure that I was -- that the revenue that was increased was --

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: But I have a selfish reason to come here. And that's also because as anybody who plays golf knows, this has been a very sensitive subject this season. And I wanted an opportunity to try to explain that's why we are limiting it to one day a week and it's not going to negatively affect -- our revenues won't be - won't be making extra money because of it, but we should not be in shortfall because of that, so.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Well, I think also you know, we've heard so much from so many people in the community. I think that we should set up a committee like we do for the tree. And every council person and the supervisor, everyone on the town board is allowed to nominate one person to be on that. And so they represent, but that --and then usually a town board member is the one that heads it. Like our Waterfront Advisory Committee. But I think we should definitely have something like that. So we can definitely --especially since we're going to be going out for a bid for this. So I hope that we can set up a golf advisory committee in 2023.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: That's not my decision to make, but okay. I would just hope they'd be able to move quickly enough.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: They said there is --

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Oh, there is one in the --

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: I know there was one and my understanding is that it hasn't met in a long time, but it was never disbanded.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: I think the last time they met was May 2020. I think I was looking. Oh, I might be wrong about that date, but it was a couple of years ago. And the contract itself specifically references an advisory committee, so

(Crosstalk).

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: But now I think the goal is to keep the course operating.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Yeah.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Until, because this is all moot after January 1 if we don't have an extension in place.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: Well -- yeah. But this is a good opportunity to think --you know, proactively. And if we are going to go out with an RFP for a new contract next year, it's going to take some time to figure out what's going to be in that RFP. What does the board

want? What does the town want, right? So.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Yeah. Which is why we asked for an extension. That's right.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: But in the contract, it says that we have to have that advisory committee, so we should reconvene that.

DEPUTY SUPERVISOR SCALERO: Did that answer the financials?

For anyone who's unaware, for just about a year now, the Town of North Hempstead has been without an appointed controller. Last December before my administration took office, the town's controller and chief deputy controller put a notice of their resignations, which were subsequently not shared with my transition team before I took office. For the past year, we've been working in a bipartisan manner to search for a new town controller. Through this search, the job has been publicly posted four separate times, and although we've had numerous interviews and some promising candidates, for one reason or another, all candidates have either withdrawn or turned the job down when offered it, leaving the town without a controller to this very day. That brings us to Mr. Morris, who is an extremely qualified candidate with over 15 years of municipal accounting experience. Mr. Morris previously served as controller for the Town of Smithtown, Village treasurer for the villages of Mastic Beach and Westbury, Director of Finance here in the Town of North Hempstead during May Newburger's time, and over 10 years of consulting for various municipalities across the island. Beyond this municipal experience, Mr. Morris has extensive CPA firm experience in the private sector as well. Mr. Morris is an excellent candidate and ready, willing, and able to take the job as soon as this coming week. So, I am excited to bring him aboard. This is an important step here today for the future of our town. We've been without a controller for far too long already, and having no controller not only puts our town at risk financially, it could lead to things that would potentially jeopardize our triple-A bond rating. For the past six months, my director of finance, Paul Wood, has been serving as acting controller in order to keep the department functional throughout the audit and budget session, in the face of losing both the controller and chief deputy at the same time. Mr. Wood has done an admiral job for six long months doing the work of three people for no additional pay and I thank him for that. But I know this is a role he neither asked for nor wishes to continue in. With that, I'm happy to offer the resolution and move for its adoption to appoint John Morris as town controller.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: There were resolutions placed by you, I believe Councilwoman Lurvey, the past two months, and you pulled them right before the meeting. So, I cannot understand delaying the hiring of a controller any longer. There is no other candidate and this is a candidate who is ready, willing, and able and has the experience that we're looking for. So, I can't understand why you pulled the resolution without discussion the last two months. And I -- and this is something that has been communicated. I did very much hope that you would support this for the sake of the town and its residents. I vote, aye

COUNCILMAN WALSH: I've also heard the word dictator back and forth, but I'd like anybody to give me an example in history of a dictator that's overruled anytime they try to appoint anybody anyway, so you keep using the word dictator, two people over here and I think that's outrageous. Give me an example in history where a dictator has overruled all the time.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: I would like to just point out, Supervisor DeSena where you talked about -- that's a placeholder as you know, you've been here long enough, you know, the way this works, that we have a deadline that's always two weeks prior to a board meeting that you have to put a place sometimes, you have to put a placeholder on and they're removed, the placeholders are removed, but it's there just to see in case together, all seven of us agreed on something. So, it was removed because there was no agreement. So that's the way, that's why those were on there. They were placeholders and when there was no one to fill in there, that's why it was removed.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: But my question is, why is there no one to fill in there? We have a candidate. Why do you prefer to have an empty spot than to have a good candidate take the job?

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Well, I -- I mean, first of all, I did a search on him when I saw it, and I want to know why in Smithtown he was let go. He was let go because "it did not work out to our satisfaction," was a quote by a councilman. Also, it also states that he ignored questions from council members during the preparation of the 2012 budget. So right there, I just went through a budget process that was horrific.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: It was horrific because we had no controller and no deputy controller.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: But now

SUPERVISOR DESENA: But I think that you wanted that horror show.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: No --

SUPERVISOR DESENA: I think that you liked the chaos.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: So, what I'm saying is why would I vote for somebody who did not, during the budget, the 2012 budget of Smithtown, why would I vote for that person,

if they were ignoring questions? You know, it's a Newsday article, anyone can look it up. But it's -I -- I have to say that that's the reason why I'm voting no because I want someone in that position that is going to be answering all of our questions.

COUNCILMAN WALSH: Does anybody believe that?

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: It's right here --

COUNCILMAN WALSH: Yeah, was that a question, why would you vote no? The reason why you would vote no if that was a question is because you don't want the supervisor to have any kind of accomplishment at all. And you want to make sure that there is, regardless of how it affects the people who live in the town of North Hempstead we're going to make sure that there is no controller.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Councilman Walsh, are you familiar with the article?

COUNCILMAN WALSH: Yes, I am. (Cross-talk).

SUPERVISOR DESENA: I am familiar. In case you didn't know, sometimes town boards do things to make work harder for the supervisor. And this is another case where there -- there were some political considerations. So I - I may think everyone's familiar with town boards making life difficult for supervisor.

COUNCILMAN WALSH: It's the same exact thing they made the --

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Supervisor, maybe if you communicated a little bit more, we would have this board --

SUPERVISOR DESENA: Councilwoman Lurvey and I have sat in on several interviews with candidates and I thought that you all were interested in hiring a controller.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: Did I ever say that I was interested in hiring this controller? No. You put him on without getting confirmation that I was interested in hiring this controller.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: He was recommended by your staff member for us to interview for a final vote.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: Yes. He was one of the finalists. He was one of the finalists but did we reach an agreement? No, you put them on without an agreement.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Yeah, but that's not the --

SUPERVISOR DESENA: The town needs a controller.

COUNCILMAN WALSH: Yeah.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: You're absolutely right.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: I don't think this is the right -- the right one.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: Okay. Next item, please.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Item No. 50, a resolution appointing Douglas Schlaefer as the superintendent of highway

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: I am very happy to be in a position where I can recommend that we move the motion to hire Doug Schlaefer as the town's next highway superintendent. I have the pleasure of working with Doug while I was the director of operations in Town of North

Hempstead. And while I did not have direct supervision over Doug, I had indirect supervision as the highway department was part of my portfolio responsibilities. I found Doug to be extremely knowledgeable about the town's operations. He is one of the smartest people I know, period. And that's substantiated by his having the highest score in all of Nassau County on the highway maintenance supervisor position. I am sure that Doug is up and able for the job, but what I appreciate perhaps most about it is that Doug has went into retirement and doesn't need the headache of running as a highway department, but he wants to come back out of his love for the town and wants to assist in restoring the town's highway department to its former glory. I'm happy to offer the resolution and move for its adoption and I vote, aye.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Yeah. Councilman Troiano?

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Aye.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilman Zuckerman? On this item?

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: It's a couple folks.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: I guess we have a couple of cards.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: We have cards. We can get started. Pete Gaffney.

MR. GAFFNEY: This actually pertains to 50 and 51 if you vote and approve on it, congratulations to the two. But I just want to point out that whoever is the decision maker on this, that you have all those pots on Hillside Avenue that need to be awarded. Now in the Community Benefit Fund, there is now going to be pots on Jericho Turnpike. Now there's also going to be some in -- in the Westbury Carle Place area, apparently, according to the community benefit's funds. In addition to that, last year when they were walking and figuring out the planting for Atlantic Avenue, the previous council person committed the town to providing the water for that. So I'm just letting you know that one's probably about, maybe 70, 80 trees in plants and bushes. That's all. This one -- give my two cents. Last thing, this is going to be my last meeting for a while coming here just because, I don't know, maybe I'm coming here too much or whatever, but, you know, I speak about things about my community, which I really love, and also parts of the town that I feel are important, that are involved. And I just feel like, you know, when I do speak, it basically goes in one ear and out the other. So, I'll be returning, but I don't know when. Thank you.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Thank you, Miles Mart (phonetic).

MR. MART: What kind of formal education does Doug have for the job?

SUPERVISOR DESENA: I don't how to respond to him.

COUNCILMAN WALSH: I don't know either.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: You're asking about education?

MR. MART: Correct.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: You're asking the question for a purpose I imagine, so what's the point of that question?

MR. MART: I'm asking what kind of formal education --

(Cross-talk)

MR. MART: Does he have high school? Does he have a college degree?

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: You know --

MR. MART: Does he have an engineering degree or what?

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Is that a requirement of the supervisor?

MR. MART: I don't know, you guys know.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: So, I mean, what's the relevancy of your question, because it's not a requirement of that position. So he.

MR. MART: I believe it would be, it should be, if it didn't.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: So, in terms of education, I don't have his resume in front of me, but I know he has 30 years of experience --

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Correct.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: -- in a Highway Department.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Correct.

MR. MART: Now, from Tommy Tiernan until now, where has your search been, and how many candidates did you interview, and you came up with these two people?

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: So, the job was posted?

MR. MART: Right.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: I believe there were some 20-plus resumes that came in.

MR. MART: Right.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: These resumes were reviewed by staff.

MR. MART: Right.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: And the supervisor and I interviewed the final few that you know, that the staff identified as I would call them finalists or something like that.

MR. MART: I totally disagree with your resolution. There should be some other people interviewed prior to getting the position. Plus, the other one you have is the superintendent of Highway also. Is he a deputy Superintendent Highway?

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: It's a separate agenda item.

MR. MART: Right. I understand.

COUNCILMAN WALSH: You need to ask your question in the next item.

MR. MART: Okay, that's fine.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: We'll have to wait and see.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Thank you. Michael O'Donald (phonetic).

MR. LODDONA: Well, --

SUPERVISOR DESENA: We're not forcing you to do extra work if you didn't want to.

MR. ODONALD: Time to go.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Well, you can't ask questions about 51.

MR. ODONALD: Oh.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: That's right.

MR. DIAL: Michael O'Donald, 15 Nugent Street in North New Hyde Park. The gentlemen who are receiving the superintendent positions and highways. I hope this board makes them keenly aware, adamantly aware of their obligation, the written contract with the State of New York, and this town for Hillside Avenue, the medium. And that the individuals who get the position do what they're supposed to do there and not drag their feet, not have to come back and threaten the town with lawsuit because everybody's playing games. We saw last year where -- oh, we don't have water, but there was a little dinky ding tank, but Port Washington had two water tanks. Come on. We have people who wander around this town. We just don't stay in our own little North New Hyde Park here. If you'd like to look around the rest of the town, I wander all over this town, everybody's district. So please, whoever gets these positions of superintendents, whether number 50, number 51, please make them adamantly aware of what they're supposed to be doing on Hillside Avenue. And just a little jump back before I raise my hand. I thank you, supervisor, but I couldn't speak. This boat dock is it 50,000 or 5,000, to remove it and fix it in whatever it's got to be done to it. The boat dock.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: You're talking about the Half Hollow, I mean Harbor Hills budget.

MR. LODDONA: Yeah. Is that a 50,000 thing or is it a 5000? We're sitting here going -- what is --

COUNCILMAN ADHAMI: 5,500.

MR. LODDONA: Thank you, Council. The answer is presented. Thank you. Enjoy.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Thank you. Let's continue with the voting.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: If there are no more cards, would you call the roll?

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: No, we are done with the cards. I'm going to call the votes. Councilman Troiano?

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: So, I already made my statement about Doug Schlaefer.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Mm-hmm.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: So I'll just say ditto and I vote, aye.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilman Zuckerman.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Doug Schlafer has proved to be an effective and efficient employee of the town of North Hempstead. He has a multiple track record of success as the Commissioner of Public Works and Superintendent of Highways for the Village of Manorhaven. He possesses the knowledge necessary to succeed in this role, and we are fortunate to have him as our new highway superintendent. I vote aye.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilman Walsh.

COUNCILMAN WALSH: No.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilwoman Lurvey.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: So, during Mr. Schlaefer's long career, he's demonstrated extensive knowledge and skill regarding the daily operations of the town's highway department. He is eminently qualified and we're excited to have him take the lead as superintendent of highways for the town. During the interview, it was clear that he has an understanding of what we need, whether it's related to storm preparedness, tree planting, and maintenance, and all the other extremely important tasks of the highway department. I vote aye.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilman Adhami.

COUNCILMAN ADHAMI: No.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Council Dalimonte.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: I would like to extend my sincere thanks to everyone who stepped up over the past several months. As his search process, this bipartisan search process took place. That includes: Victor Thomas, Ryan Waterson, John Sullivan, and others. You've gone above and beyond and I appreciate your hard work. I truly do. I vote aye.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Supervisor DeSena.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: I want to thank those employees also who have done an incredible job for the town. But I vote no.

year regarding nominees for boards and commissions, she has submitted a financial disclosure form 30 days in advance for review by our board of ethics. And she was approved. Approving the appointment of Rachel Fox will bring us one step closer to giving the town for the first time in a number of years, an ethics board serving in defined, staggered terms, independent and autonomous of outside influence. A fully independent ethics board will give the town the strongest possible ethical firewall against conflicts of interest and misdeeds. With that, I'm proud to offer the resolution and move its adoption.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: I would like to make a statement first.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: I just made a movement. I just made a motion.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Well, I think it's very important for the board to - -

COUNCILMAN WALSH: Let's ask the attorney, is this okay.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: John, is it okay because I think it's very important for the Board to hear my statement before they vote.

MR. CHIARA: Well, I think --

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: I mean --

MR. CHIARA: -- you're allowed --

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: because my name was used.

MR. CHIARA: -- you're allowed to discuss whether your name is -- whether your name is used or not you're allowed to discuss that.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Okay.

MR. CHIARA: Before the --

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: It's a motion and then you have discussion on the motion.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Okay. So as everyone knows, the Board of Ethics serves a critical role here in North Hempstead, and the current members of the board have served with distinction fulfilling their oaths effectively and efficiently. Ms. Fox is very good friends with the supervisor, and I have a personal relationship with her as well. I made it clear to the supervisor and to Ms. Fox that this could be easily present the perception of a conflict of interest. We really aren't supposed to appoint people we have personal friendships with, for obvious reasons. The supervisor has previously nominated people for the ethics board knowing the nomination would fail. And in the case, you did it again to make some sort of political statement, but supervisor, you approached me after the meeting, and then I sent you an e-mail on October 28th at 9:40 p.m. telling you that because of your personal relationship, your very close personal relationship and my relationship, I could not support her nomination. So, I just want to make sure, and I'm going to send this e-mail to comments -- clerk, so this could be put into the record.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: And I'll just add to that statement. I met Rachel Fox during my year as a supervisor because she does attend every event in Port Washington. So, somebody who is that involved is going to have friendships with many people. That is the point, is that, that somebody is trusted in the community. So, I dare say that other members of the ethics board are - - might also have friendly relationships with members on this board. So it is not a factor what

you described in your email friendship is simply not a factor in whether somebody is deserving and would serve well on the ethics board. So it is not a factor that we have considered before, I mean, we discussed Robin Bowling (phonetic), she's a wonderful candidate. She serves on the school district board with Councilman Troiano. Why didn't he object that they were friends? I mean, I just don't -- I think that the people can see what's going on. And when you say you won't vote for her because you're friends with her I think they understand what's really going on.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: No, I really --

SUPERVISOR DESENA: If you thought she was a good candidate for the -- for the board, you would support her. Would you call the roll, please?

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Council Troiano?

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: I want to thank the supervisor for her comments, introducing Rachel Fox as a candidate. She picked up some of the themes that I've been speaking about since January. One of the --

SUPERVISOR DESENA: I am learning. We do very well. We're learning from each other.

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: And I do agree with that. So, I've got one for Joe and one for you tonight. And you know, one of the observations I've made since January was that there's, the town code requires that the supervisor consult with town council people, and that was not happening before. The supervisor just mentioned that when it came to her nomination of ethics board member now Robin Bowling, that she did in fact consult. And I talked with Robin. And -- but I've also mentioned that it's important that the members of the ethics committee look like the town, that there'd be geographic diversity within the town, racial diversity, ethnic diversity, and so on. And supervisor mentioned just now that Rachel Fox's and you know, I don't know her being part of or against the LGBTQ -- my initials right, I'm sorry, LGBTQ+ community does add to the diversity and does make us the committee look like - like - like the rest of the town. Unfortunately, we can't increase diversity through subtraction, because the appointment of Rachel Fox to replace Betty Leon, who is the only, I believe Asian member of the committee, and the Asian American community is a growing community in the town, I don't feel that I can support that given who Rachel is replacing. And in case Rachel is watching or in the event that Rachel's friend should talk to her, I am -- this is not a vote against Rachel per se. This is a vote in support of diversity. I vote no.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilman Zuckerman.

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: I echo the same sentiments as Councilman Troiano. I vote no.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilman Walsh.

COUNCILMAN WALSH: I think everybody sees what's going on here. This has been going on since we got here. They're not going to allow the supervisor to have anybody that she chooses to be on this ethics board. There's just going to be one abstain -- abstention or no, after the other. I vote yes, and I'm very happy to vote, yes.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilwoman Lurvey.

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: So, my concern over the months that we have discussed ethics board nominations has been the staggered nature of the replacement of ethics board members.

And my recommendation has always been to continue best practices related to ethics boards. Members should not be replaced all at once, members should be replaced gradually. As the supervisor mentioned, four members have been approved by this board this year. So, I see what's going on. We have had agreement; we just don't agree on every nominee. This is not a vote against Rachel Fox from everything that I have heard and I have read she would be, she's a wonderful member of the community. But I vote no.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilman Adhami.

COUNCILMAN ADHAMI: Aye.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilman, Dalimonte.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: I abstain.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Supervisor DeSena.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: I'll just note that I have nominated two members from the Asian American community and you all have rejected them. I also nominated a member of the Hispanic community from Port Washington and you have rejected him. So, I have done very well to try and nominate a diverse board. You treat these volunteers terribly and some of them have asked to be removed from consideration because of the way they've been treated. So, I think it's just a shame that we have volunteers willing to help and interested in helping and you keep rejecting them.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: Supervisor DeSena, I approved, I know four people that you have appointed.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: Two of them were already serving.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: But I could have them.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: Okay. They were giving them terms. They already were serving. You did not let me approve Scott Straus (phonetic) for Mineola. I mean, it's incredible the people who I nominated, I mean Melissa Slobin (phonetic) from Great Neck. You have rejected. It's just -it's a pattern. Everyone sees what's going on. I vote aye and I'm --

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: So, Supervisor DeSena, you talk about the way we've been treating the people that you're nominating. What about the people that have been serving I hear from --

SUPERVISOR DESENA: I have spoken with them. Well, I spoke with one of them actually just the last two days and I asked him, would you like to keep serving? He said, yeah, he'd like another term. So, here's the thing.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: So, are you going to the -- for the other new term?

SUPERVISOR DESENA: The town code says that people should serve in four-year terms.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: So --

SUPERVISOR DESENA: Are you simply -- excuse me.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: I'm just asking a question.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: He is in an expired term, that is what he is in.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: But no, he asked you if he -- I don't know who it is and I don't want to know, but he asked you if you would appoint him for another term. He's asking you.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: And I did not discuss what term he is in. He is in an expired term.

COUNCILMAN WALSH: And while we're on that subject a little while back, you had told us all when we were sitting in this back room here, that the people on the ethics board, this is going back several months, that the people on the ethics board were very upset and that they came to you per se and were concerned about being taken off the ethics board and I think that's kind of unethical that you would even have that conversation with.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: I really don't even, it's funny you --

COUNCILMAN WALSH: You may not remember but we were all seated back with attorney

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: No, it's funny.

COUNCILMAN WALSH: -- sitting there also.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: I was at an event or an event that, and someone came up to me and was like, hi, I'm so-and-so. I didn't even know they were on the ethics board. I've met with the ethics board twice.

COUNCILMAN WALSH: Yeah. But you did tell us all in the back room here that you spoke with people on the ethics board and they told you, they didn't tell me, they told you that they were upset that they were not going to remain on the ethics board. So obviously you had a conversation with somebody.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: I didn't recall.

COUNCILMAN WALSH: You do recall that conversation.

COUNCILWOMAN DALIMONTE: I know one person on there so.

COUNCILMAN WALSH: Oh, okay. So was there one, but you said they, so they meaning more than one. So how many people did you discuss on the ethics board with, you know about they're wanting to stay?

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: I don't recall that conversation.

(Cross-talk)

SUPERVISOR DESENA: I think everyone has voted. Please call the next item. Please call the next item. We've all voted.

(Cross-talk)

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Item No. 53, a resolution authorizing the extension of an engineering panel for building department permitting matters.

SUPERVISOR DESENA: I offer the resolution and move for its adoption.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilman Troiano?

COUNCILMAN TROIANO: Aye.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilman Zuckerman?

COUNCILMAN ZUCKERMAN: Aye.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilman Walsh?

COUNCILMAN WALSH: Aye.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilwoman Lurvey?

COUNCILWOMAN LURVEY: Aye.

CLERK SRIVASTAVA: Councilman Adhami?

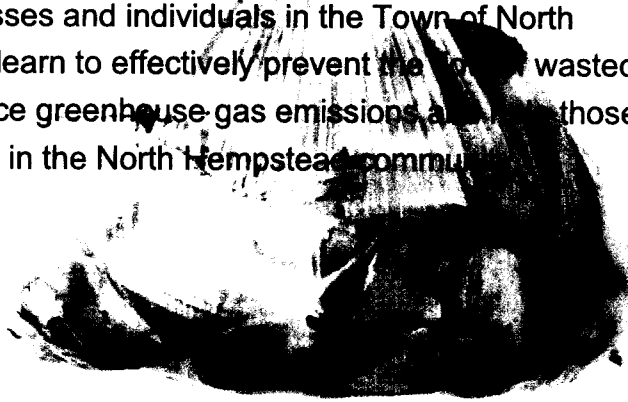

PURPOSE

The primary objective of the Town's Climate Action Planning (CAP) is to create an engaging, inclusive, community-wide process that identifies and prioritizes goals, strategies, and initiatives that will conserve energy and reduce greenhouse gas emissions both from Town operations and throughout the community.

The purpose of the Organics Management Plan is to help both businesses and individuals in the Town of North Hempstead learn to effectively prevent the loss of wasted food to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and those in need of food in the North Hempstead community.



Introduction:

According to the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) in the United States, food waste is estimated at between 30 and 40 percent of the food supply and ReFED stated that in 2019, 35% of food in the United States went unsold or uneaten. Most of this waste is sent to landfills or is incinerated. According to Feeding America 43% of food waste comes from households.



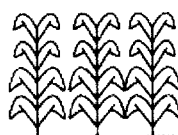

Most people don't think about how much food waste they produce and its negative impacts on the environment, including climate change. According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, in the United States, food waste is the single largest category of material placed in municipal landfills. Once there, it releases methane, which is an even more potent greenhouse gas than carbon dioxide. When food is wasted, all the energy and water it takes to grow, harvest, transport, and package it is also wasted. It is estimated that we could reduce about 6% to 8% of all human-caused greenhouse gas emissions if we stop wasting food. In the United States, the production of lost or wasted food creates greenhouse gas emissions that equal the emissions of 32.6 million cars (World Wildlife Fund).

Another major negative implication of food waste is the fact of hunger throughout the United States. Specifically, on Long Island approximately 259,000 people suffer from food insecurity including 79,000 children. About 34% of food insecure people in Nassau County are not eligible for nutrition assistance programs such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and therefore don't have enough support to put food on the table. Research has shown that lack of food can cause behavioral issues, reduced ability to learn social skills and impaired cognitive learning in children, as well as lack of stamina, increased illness, depression, and anxiety in adults and the elderly (Long Island Cares; Feeding America).

One of the ways to combat food waste and food insecurity is the use of food banks. These are said to be the single most important source of food for agencies with emergency food providers, accounting for 69% of the food distributed by pantries, 39% of the food distributed by kitchens and 45% of the food distributed by shelters (Long Island Cares; Feeding America).

With this plan we strive to help both businesses and individuals in the Town of North Hempstead learn to effectively prevent the flow of wasted food in order to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and help those in need of food in the North Hempstead community.

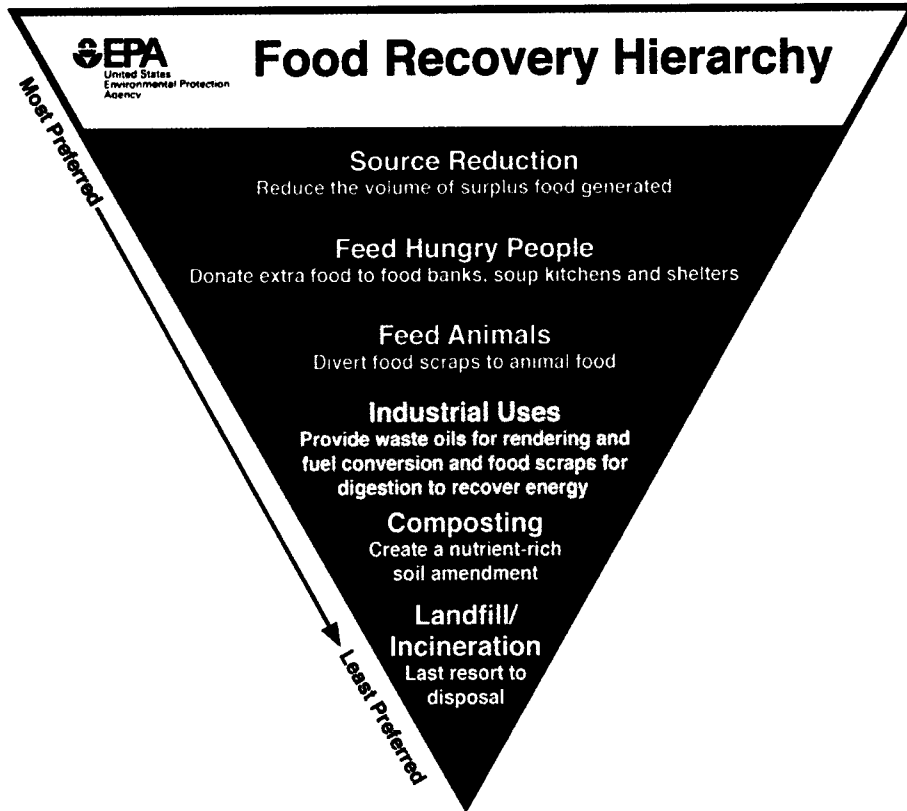

Objectives of the Organics Management Plan:

This plan utilizes the U.S. EPA Food recovery hierarchy to prioritize the following goals:

1. Prevention
2. Donation
3. Diversion



To reach this goal we plan to use a variety of strategies:

- Education of residents and local businesses on preventing food waste and reducing the volume of surplus food in our community.
- Creation of strategies to support, facilitate and educate the community on food recovery and food donation by working with local food banks.
- Education and tools for home composting, as well as local community composting.

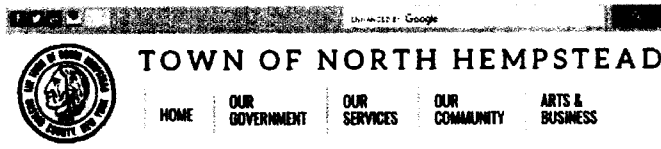
We believe this plan will lead to reduced food waste and greater food security for North Hempstead residents, thereby reducing the resources needed for food production (water, land, gasoline, energy, labor, pesticides, fertilizers), as well as greenhouse gas emissions.

Program Elements:

1. Prevention: Source Reduction

The Town of North Hempstead Climate Smart Communities Task Force discussed strategies on source reduction of food waste. The following was agreed upon as the best ways to educate residents, businesses, and institutions on how they can reduce food waste and what they can do with surplus food. A broad coalition of stakeholders will be used to ensure broad outreach.

- o Creation and dissemination of tips on the following topics, through a dedicated webpage (<https://northhempsteadny.gov/foodwastetips>), press releases, social media, and more:
 - Smart shopping
 - Smart storage
 - Repurposing food before throwing away
 - Reducing waste while eating at restaurants



#1 PREVENTION

Here are some great tips to reduce your volume of surplus food:

Smart Shopping

- Take an inventory of the food in the house so you don't buy what you already have.
- Make a meal menu for the week.
- Make a list and stick to it.
- Buy fresh items in smaller quantities.
- Resist impulse buys by shopping on a full stomach.
- Shop at farmer's markets. Local produce is likely to stay fresh longer since it was picked more recently than supermarket produce.
- Intentionally purchase imperfect produce that might otherwise be discarded.

Smart Storage

- 'FIFO' stands for 'first in, first out' and is a useful way to organize food at home.
- Invest in quality food containers that do not leak and are light and convenient to carry.
- Keep your refrigerator below 41°F.
- Store cooked foods on shelves above raw foods.
- Some fruits give off natural gases that make nearby foods spoil faster. Store apples, bananas, and tomatoes apart from other perishables to help keep them fresh longer.
- Writing down types of foods that go bad can help identify the foods to eat before use.
- Freezing foods can help preserve them for later use. Divide food into individual portions that can be defrosted separately.
- Do not overfill your fridge and freezer. Leave enough space so cold air can circulate.

Think twice before throwing food away

- Many greens and vegetables may slightly soften or wilt when they are just past ripe. They still may make excellent additions to soups, smoothies, or baked dishes.
- Manufacturers put different labels on foods, such as "sell by" or "use by." The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) estimates that up to 20% of food waste comes from the confusion over these dates. The easiest way to identify bad foods is to trust your senses. For dairy products, check for an off color, mold, or a sour smell. If produce still appears fresh and usable, it is usually fine to eat it.
- Choose 1 or 2 days each week to eat any leftovers you may have stored in the fridge or freezer.

- o Outreach through our stakeholders, including local Chambers of Commerce, Business Improvement Districts, religious organizations, civic associations, libraries, and additional nonprofit organizations.

2. Donation: Feed Hungry People

The focus of this strategy will be the donation of excess food to food banks and how the Town can facilitate this through outreach. By donating food, we are feeding people, not landfills, supporting local communities and saving all the resources that went into producing that food from going to waste.

▪ Education of Residents and Businesses

- o A list of all local food banks (<https://northhempsteadny.gov/foodbanks>) including webpages and contact information, to use in outreach.
- o Social media posts will also be used throughout the year to direct residents on where and how to donate excess food.
- o We will reach out to our stakeholders including local Business Improvement Districts and Chambers of Commerce to make sure they are aware of local food banks where food can be donated.

▪ Food Scraps Producers

- o In 2022 a New York State Department of Environmental Conservation law went into effect that requires Designated Food Scrap Generators (DFSG) or businesses and institutions that generate 2 tons or more of food scraps per week, to comply with donation requirements or both donation and recycling (composting/recycling facility) requirements. Currently there are no composting facilities in the Town for businesses to process food waste. As these facilities are built the Town will help educate local businesses of this law.

3. Diversion: Composting

Another way the Town can reduce waste is to help residents use food scraps for composting at home. Composting involves the breaking down of yard and kitchen waste into a nutrient rich soil amendment.

It provides many benefits including reducing the amount of waste that ends up in landfills or combustion facilities, providing valuable plant nutrients, improving soil structure, adding beneficial soil organisms, suppressing plant diseases, reducing the need for fertilizers and pesticides, and helping to prevent soil erosion and nutrient runoff.

The Town of North Hempstead, therefore, sells compost bins to its residents at a discounted cost to encourage composting and its environmental benefits. With each bin residents receive a manual on how to use it properly including what materials to include and how to maintain the bin.

The Town also offers free workshops to its residents on Sustainable Yard Care each spring, which includes instruction on how to compost. More information on the program can be found at northhempsteadny.gov/sustainability.

The Town will also educate residents about a Community Composting program at the Long Island Science Museum run by a local nonprofit Transition Town. They have collected 7,000 pounds of food waste since 2020. Learn more at transitiontownpw.org

Conclusions:

Wasted food is one of largest generators of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions globally. Thirty to forty percent of food is wasted each year, and 43% of that food waste occurs at the household level.

Food production, transportation, and handling of food waste generate significant carbon dioxide (CO₂) emissions. When food ends up in landfills, it generates methane, an even more potent greenhouse gas.

The Town of North Hempstead aims to reduce food waste using the U.S. EPA Food recovery Hierarchy to prioritize solutions: #1 Prevent, #2 Donate, #3 Divert.

The implementation of this organics management plan is part of The Town's overall Climate Action Planning, providing residents and businesses throughout the town education and resources to reduce GHG emissions and therefore help the Town reduce its impact on climate change.

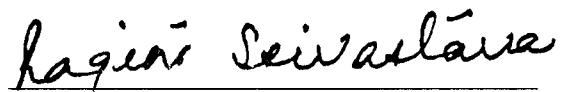
