Mainly we convey positive thoughts about samples rather than a true critique. We would love more participants. "IYOW" is fun, challenging with no pressure. We are all learning, listening, trying to cope and thrive during this crazy year.- Janet

Why do I LOVE the IYOW group? I am no expert writer by any stretch of the imagination. The words don't flow easily like rain down a gutter. Having a deadline of twice a month is not too taxing, but sometimes the bit of pressure is helpful. Somedays I can type a long-winded story from my life. Somedays it's a short paragraph or two from a quick memory jog. No novels swirl in my head. I'm just hoping to capture parts of my past with the unique family that I have been blessed with. IYOW seemed like a healthy mother/daughter activity as my mom moved in with me. After a hairline fracture on her hip, she wasn't going to walk up a flight of stairs and live independently anymore. I had long moved out of that Greenwich Village apartment. I was just 16 but fell in love with the guy who I would eventually marry. Writing was a mainstay for her life, and I would admire her talents. There were organizations that needed her editing or creative ideas. She wrote for a burgeoning humor magazine started by Roger Price called "GRUMP." She was the second Vice President of the Manhattan chapter of NOW (National Organization of Women.) There were also many poetry readings I could attend. I had hoped the current writing group would reconnect brain synapses that are slipping away too quickly. As I watch her, I can only work on myself and keep my brain active with



PI Transportation Program

PI Taxi services for food shopping and medical appointments will continue to be free to the rider through the end of July, including tips, to help keep distance between the rider and driver during the COVID-19 pandemic.



In order to help facilitate vaccine distribution, the Town of North Hempstead and Project Independence have expanded our transportation initiative to include the areas outside of North Hempstead including the Northport VA Medical Center and Long Island University Post, Nassau University Medical Center, SUNY Old Westbury, Nassau Community College, and Nassau Veterans Memorial Coliseum which are all vaccination sites in our area. PI members with vaccination appointments at these locations can call 311 in order to schedule a ride. Please call to book at least one day in advance.

The PI Transportation program also services people with disabilities who reside in the Town ages 21 – 59. Residents can call 311 or 516-869-6311, to make an appointment.





PI Social Worker & Nurse Updates
